- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 537, Government Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 CHAPTER 537. MEDICAID <u>BLOCK GRANT AND</u> REFORM <u>WAIVERS</u> [WAIVER]
- 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 537, Government Code, is amended by
- 9 adding Section 537.001 to read as follows:
- 10 Sec. 537.001. MEDICAID BLOCK GRANT WAIVER LEGISLATIVE
- 11 OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE. (a) In this section:
- 12 (1) "Committee" means the Medicaid Block Grant Waiver
- 13 <u>Legislative Oversight Committee created under this section.</u>
- 14 (2) "Medicaid block grant funding system" means a
- 15 system of funding Medicaid that provides for a set total amount of
- 16 federal financial participation regardless of program enrollment.
- 17 (b) If the federal government authorizes states to opt to
- 18 receive the federal share of money for the operation of Medicaid
- 19 through a Medicaid block grant funding system or requires that
- 20 states receive that money through a Medicaid block grant funding
- 21 system, the Medicaid Block Grant Waiver Legislative Oversight
- 22 Committee is created as provided by this section to facilitate
- 23 waiver efforts with respect to the system by which Medicaid is
- 24 funded in this state.

1	(c) The committee is composed of eight members, as follows:
2	(1) four members of the senate, appointed by the
3	lieutenant governor; and
4	(2) four members of the house of representatives,
5	appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
6	(d) A member of the committee serves at the pleasure of the
7	appointing official.
8	(e) The lieutenant governor and speaker of the house of
9	representatives shall each designate a co-chair from among the
10	committee members.
11	(f) A member of the committee may not receive compensation
12	for serving on the committee but is entitled to reimbursement for
13	travel expenses incurred by the member while conducting the
14	business of the committee as provided by the General Appropriations
15	Act.
16	(g) The committee shall:
17	(1) facilitate the design and development of a
18	Medicaid block grant waiver;
19	(2) facilitate a smooth transition from existing
20	Medicaid payment systems and benefit designs to a new model of
21	Medicaid enabled by the waiver described by Subdivision (1) of this
22	subsection;
23	(3) meet at the call of the presiding officer; and
24	(4) research, take public testimony, and issue reports
25	requested by the lieutenant governor or speaker of the house of

- 2 (i) The committee shall use existing staff of the senate,
- 3 the house of representatives, and the Texas Legislative Council to
- 4 assist the committee in performing its duties under this section.
- 5 (j) Chapter 551 applies to the committee.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- $7\,$ a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
