- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 213.033, Labor Code, is amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 Sec. 213.033. LIMITATIONS. (a) The commission may not
- 8 begin a civil action in court or make an assessment under this
- 9 subchapter to collect a contribution, a penalty, or interest from
- 10 an employer after the third anniversary after the due date of the
- 11 contribution.
- 12 (b) The following actions suspend the running of the
- 13 limitations period prescribed under Subsection (a):
- 14 (1) an administrative hearing to redetermine the
- 15 liability for a contribution, a penalty, or interest pending before
- 16 the commission; and
- 17 (2) a judicial proceeding pending in a court of
- 18 competent jurisdiction to redetermine the liability for a
- 19 contribution, a penalty, or interest; and
- 20 (23) a bankruptcy case begun under Title 11 of the
- 21 United States Code pending before the court.
- (c) After a hearing, judicial proceeding or case described
- 23 by Subsection (b) is closed, the running of the limitations period
- 24 prescribed under Subsection (a) resumes.

- 1 (d) In the case of a wilful attempt to evade the provisions 2 of this subtitle or a commission rule adopted under this subtitle, 3 the action or assessment may be begun or made at any time.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
