- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by 5
- adding Subchapter P to read as follows: 6
- SUBCHAPTER P. CAMO ALERT FOR MISSING MILITARY MEMBERS 7
- Sec. 411.441. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 8
- 9 (1) "Alert" means the statewide camo alert for missing
- military members that is developed and implemented under this 10
- subchapter. 11

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- 12 (2) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law
- enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of a 13
- missing military member. 14

- (3) "Military member" means a person who is a current 15
- 16 or former member of the United States armed forces, including the
- National Guard or a reserve or auxiliary unit of any branch of the 17
- armed forces. 18
- Sec. 411.442. CAMO ALERT FOR MISSING MILITARY MEMBERS. 19
- With the cooperation of the Texas Department of Transportation, the 20
- office of the governor, and other appropriate law enforcement 21
- agencies in this state, the department shall develop and implement 22
- 23 a statewide camo alert to be activated on behalf of a missing
- military member who suffers from a mental illness, including 24

- 1 post-traumatic stress disorder, or a traumatic brain injury.
- 2 Sec. 411.443. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The director is the
- 3 statewide coordinator of the alert.
- 4 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as
- 5 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules
- 6 and directives must include:
- 7 (1) the procedures to be used by a local law
- 8 enforcement agency to verify whether a military member:
- 9 (A) is missing; and
- 10 (B) suffers from a mental illness, including
- 11 post-traumatic stress disorder, or a traumatic brain injury;
- 12 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 13 local law enforcement agency is required to report a missing
- 14 military member to the department; and
- 15 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 16 entity to report information about a missing military member to
- 17 designated media outlets in Texas.
- 18 (c) The director shall prescribe forms for use by local law
- 19 enforcement agencies in requesting activation of the alert system.
- Sec. 411.444. DEPARTMENT TO RECRUIT PARTICIPANTS. The
- 21 department shall recruit public and commercial television and radio
- 22 broadcasters, private commercial entities, state or local
- 23 governmental entities, the public, and other appropriate persons to
- 24 assist in developing and implementing the alert system.
- Sec. 411.445. STATE AGENCIES. (a) A state agency
- 26 participating in the alert system shall:
- 27 (1) cooperate with the department and assist in

- 1 developing and implementing the alert system; and 2 (2) establish a plan for providing relevant information to its officers, investigators, or employees, as 3 appropriate, once the alert system has been activated. 4 (b) In addition to its duties as a state agency under 5 Subsection (a), the Texas Department of Transportation shall 6 7 establish a plan for providing relevant information to the public 8 through an existing system of dynamic message signs located across the state. 9 10 Sec. 411.446. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT OF MISSING MILITARY MEMBER. (a) A local law enforcement agency shall notify 11 12 the department if the agency: (1) receives notice of a missing military member; 13 14 (2) verifies that at the time the military member is 15 reported missing: 16 (A) the person reported missing is a military 17 member; (B) the military member's location is unknown; 18 19 (C) the military member's domicile is in Texas; 20 and (D) the military member suffers from a mental 21 illness, including post-traumatic stress disorder, or a traumatic 22 23 brain injury; and 24 (3) determines that the military member's disappearance poses a credible threat to the military member's 25 26 health and safety or the health and safety of another.
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(b) The local law enforcement agency shall:

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- 1 (1) require the family or legal guardian of the
- 2 missing military member to provide documentation of the military
- 3 member's mental illness to verify the condition as required by
- 4 Subsection (a)(2)(D); and
- 5 (2) as soon as practicable, determine whether the
- 6 military member's disappearance poses a credible threat to the
- 7 military member's health and safety or the health and safety of
- 8 another for purposes of Subsection (a)(3).
- 9 Sec. 411.447. ACTIVATION OF CAMO ALERT. (a) When a local
- 10 law enforcement agency notifies the department under Section
- 11 411.446, the department shall confirm the accuracy of the
- 12 information and, if confirmed, immediately issue an alert under
- 13 this subchapter in accordance with department rules.
- 14 (b) In issuing the alert, the department shall send the
- 15 alert to designated media outlets in Texas. Following receipt of
- 16 the alert, participating radio stations, television stations, and
- 17 other media outlets may issue the alert at designated intervals to
- 18 assist in locating the missing military member.
- 19 Sec. 411.448. CONTENT OF CAMO ALERT. The alert must
- 20 include:
- 21 (1) all appropriate information that is provided by
- 22 the local law enforcement agency under Section 411.446 and that may
- 23 lead to the safe recovery of the missing military member; and
- 24 (2) a statement instructing any person with
- 25 information related to the missing military member to contact a
- 26 local law enforcement agency.
- Sec. 411.449. TERMINATION OF CAMO ALERT. (a) The director

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- 1 shall terminate any activation of the alert with respect to a
- 2 particular missing military member not later than the earlier of
- 3 the date on which:
- 4 (1) the missing military member is located or the
- 5 <u>situation is otherwise resolved; or</u>
- 6 (2) the notification period ends, as determined by
- 7 <u>department rule</u>.
- 8 (b) A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing
- 9 military member who is the subject of an alert under this subchapter
- 10 shall notify the department as soon as possible that the missing
- 11 military member has been located.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
