3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 711.001, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by amending Subdivisions (1) and (1-a) and adding
6	Subdivisions (1-b), (29), (30), (31), and (32) to read as follows:
7	(1) "Abandoned cemetery" means a cemetery, regardless
8	of whether it appears on a map or in deed records, that is not owned
9	or operated by a cemetery organization, does not have another
10	person legally responsible for its care, and is not maintained by
11	any person.
12	(1-a) "Burial park" means a tract of land that is used
13	or intended to be used for interment in graves.
14	(1-b) [ $(1-a)$ ] "Campus" means the area:
15	(A) within the boundaries of one or more adjacent
16	tracts, parcels, or lots under common ownership;
17	(B) on which the principal church building and
18	related structures and facilities of an organized religious society
19	or sect are located; and
20	(C) that may be subject to one or more easements

- 23 coroner or medical examiner under Chapter 49, Code of Criminal
- 24 Procedure, or a person described by Section 711.0105(a) may

- SECTION 3. The heading to Section 711.010, Health and

- 4 SECTION 4. Section 711.010, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection
- 6 (d) to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The owner of property on which an unknown cemetery is
- 8 discovered or on which an abandoned cemetery is located may not
- 9 construct improvements on the property in a manner that would
- 10 [further] disturb the cemetery until the human remains interred in
- 11 the cemetery are removed under a written order issued by the state
- 12 registrar or the state registrar's designee under Section
- 13 711.004(f) and under an order of a district court as provided by
- 14 this section, except as provided by Section 711.004(f-1).
- 15 (b) On petition of the owner of the property, a district
- 16 court of the county in which an unknown cemetery is discovered or an
- 17 abandoned cemetery is located may order the removal of any
- 18 dedication for cemetery purposes that affects the property if the
- 19 court finds that the removal of the dedication is in the public
- 20 interest. If a court orders the removal of a dedication of a
- 21 cemetery and all human remains <u>in that cemetery</u> [<del>on the property</del>]
- 22 have not previously been removed, the court shall order the removal
- 23 of the human remains from the cemetery to a perpetual care cemetery

- 25 (d) The Texas Historical Commission, with consent of the

- 2 SECTION 5. The heading to Section 711.011, Health and
- 3 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 711.011. FILING RECORD OF UNKNOWN OR ABANDONED
- 5 CEMETERY.
- 6 SECTION 6. Section 711.011(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) A person who discovers an unknown or abandoned cemetery
- 9 shall file notice of the discovery of the cemetery with the county
- 10 clerk of the county in which the cemetery is located and
- 11 concurrently mail notice to the landowner on record in the county
- 12 appraisal district not later than the 10th day after the date of the
- 13 discovery. The notice must contain a legal description of the land
- 14 on which the unknown or abandoned cemetery was found and describe
- 15 the approximate location of the cemetery and the evidence of the
- 16 cemetery that was discovered.
- 17 SECTION 7. Subchapter A, Chapter 711, Health and Safety
- 18 Code, is amended by adding Section 711.0111 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 711.0111. NOTICE OF UNVERIFIED CEMETERY. (a) A
- 20 person who discovers an unverified cemetery shall file notice and
- 21 evidence of the discovery with the Texas Historical Commission on a
- 22 form provided by the Texas Historical Commission, and shall
- 23 concurrently provide a copy of the notice to the landowner on record
- 24 in the county appraisal district on whose land the unverified
- 25 <u>cemetery is located.</u>
- 26 (b) The landowner described by Subsection (a) may send a
- 27 response or comments to the Texas Historical Commission concerning

- 1 the notice not later than the 30th day after the date the notice is
- 2 <u>filed.</u>
- 3 (c) The Texas Historical Commission shall evaluate the
- 4 <u>notice of the unverified cemetery, the evidence submitted with the</u>
- 5 notice, and the response of the landowner, if any, and shall
- 6 determine whether there is sufficient evidence of the existence of
- 7 <u>a cemetery.</u>
- 8 <u>(d) If the Texas Historical Commission determines</u>
- 9 sufficient evidence supports the existence of a cemetery, the Texas
- 10 Historical Commission shall inform the landowner and may file
- 11 notice of the existence of the cemetery under Section 711.011.
- 12 <u>(e)</u> If the Texas Historical Commission determines
- 13 sufficient evidence supports a determination that a cemetery does
- 14 not exist, the Texas Historical Commission shall notify the
- 15 landowner on record in the appraisal district of its determination
- 16 and amend the notice to include the commission's determination and
- 17 ensure any notice filed with a county clerk under Section 711.011 is
- 18 corrected.
- 19 SECTION 8. Section 711.041, Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 21 (d) This section does not apply to an unverified cemetery.
- 22 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
