## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 562.110, Occupations Code, is amended by
7	amending Subsections (a), (b), (d), and (e) and adding Subsection
8	(g) to read as follows:
9	(a) In this section <u>:</u>
10	(1) "Provider pharmacy" means a Class A or Class (
11	pharmacy that provides pharmacy services through a telepharmacy
12	system at a remote dispensing site.
13	(2) "Remote dispensing site" means a location licensed
14	as a telepharmacy that is authorized by a provider pharmacy through
15	a telepharmacy system to store and dispense prescription drugs and
16	devices, including dangerous drugs and controlled substances.
17	(3) "Telepharmacy [, "telepharmacy] system" means a
18	system that monitors the dispensing of prescription drugs and
19	provides for related drug use review and patient counseling

  22 (A) [(1)] audio and video;
- 23 (B)  $(\pm 2)$  still image capture; and
- (C) [(3)] store and forward.

- 1 (b) A Class A or Class C pharmacy located in this state may
- 2 provide pharmacy services, including the dispensing of drugs,
- 3 through a telepharmacy system at locations separate from [in a
- 4 facility that is not at the same location as] the Class A or Class C

- 6 (d) A telepharmacy system may be located only at:
- 7  $\underline{\text{(1)}}$  a health care facility in this state that is
- 8 regulated by this state or the United States; or
- 9 (2) a remote dispensing site.
- 10 (e) The board shall adopt rules regarding the use of a
- 11 telepharmacy system under this section, including:
- 12 (1) the types of health care facilities at which a
- 13 telepharmacy system may be located under Subsection (d)(1), which
- 14 must include the following facilities:
- 15 (A) a clinic designated as a rural health clinic
- 16 regulated under 42 U.S.C. Section 1395x(aa)[, as amended]; and
- 17 (B) a health center as defined by 42 U.S.C.
- 18 Section 254b[, as amended];
- 19 (2) the locations eligible to be licensed as remote
- 20 dispensing sites, which must include locations in medically
- 21 underserved areas, areas with a medically underserved population,
- 22 and health professional shortage areas determined by the United
- 23 States Department of Health and Human Services, and;
- 24 <u>(a) A provider pharmacy may not provide remote</u>
- 25 pharmacy services if a Class A (Community) or Class C
- 26 (Institutional) pharmacy that dispenses prescription drug orders

21	provider pharmacy be physically present at a remote dispensing site
22	when the pharmacist is providing services requiring the physical
23	presence of the pharmacist, including immunizations;
24	(E) a requirement that a remote dispensing site
25	be staffed by an on-site pharmacy technician who is under the
26	continuous supervision of a pharmacist employed by the provider

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   dispensing site;
               (4) the areas that qualify under Subsection (f);
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               (5) [(3)] recordkeeping requirements; and
               (6) [<del>(4)</del>] security requirements.
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         (g) The board by rule shall require and develop a process
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   for a remote dispensing site to apply for classification as a Class
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   A pharmacy if the average number of prescriptions dispensed per day
   at the remote dispensing site is more than 125, as calculated each
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   calendar year.
          SECTION 2. The Texas State Board of Pharmacy shall adopt
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   rules under Section 562.110, Occupations Code, as amended by this
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   Act, not later than January 1, 2018.
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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
