A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the operations of certain metropolitan rapid transit
- 3 authorities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 451.133(a), Transportation Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) An authority may not spend for capital improvements
- 8 money in excess of the <u>amounts</u> [total amount] allocated for major
- 9 capital expenditures in the annual budgets [budget].
- SECTION 2. Section 451.362, Transportation Code, is amended
- 11 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e) to read as
- 12 follows:
- 13 (a) Notwithstanding other provisions of this chapter and
- 14 except as provided by Subsections (c), [and] (d), and (e), the
- 15 board, by order or resolution, may issue bonds that are secured by
- 16 revenue or taxes of the authority if the bonds:
- 17 (1) have a term of not more than 12 months; and
- 18 (2) are payable only from revenue or taxes received on
- 19 or after the date of their issuance and before the end of the fiscal
- 20 year following the fiscal year in which the bonds are issued.
- 21 (e) In an authority confirmed before July 1, 1985, in which
- 22 the principal municipality has a population of less than one
- 23 million, bonds may have a term of not more than 15 years. The bonds
- 24 are payable only from fee revenue received on or after the date the

1 bonds are issued.

- 2 SECTION 3. Sections 451.455(h) and (i), Transportation
- 3 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 4 (h) The number of accidents per 100,000 miles is computed by
- 5 multiplying the annual number of accidents by 100,000 and dividing
- 6 the product by the number of miles for all service, including
- 7 charter and nonrevenue service, [directly operated by the
- 8 authority] for the same period. In this subsection, "accident"
- 9 includes:
- 10 (1) a collision that involves an authority's revenue
- 11 vehicle, other than a lawfully parked revenue vehicle, and that
- 12 results in property damage, injury, or death; and
- 13 (2) an incident that results in the injury or death of
- 14 a person on board or boarding or alighting from an authority's
- 15 revenue vehicle.
- 16 (i) The number of miles between mechanical road calls is
- 17 computed by dividing the annual number of miles for all service
- 18 [directly operated by an authority], including charter and
- 19 nonrevenue service, by the number of mechanical road calls for the
- 20 same period. In this subsection, "mechanical road call" means an
- 21 interruption in revenue service that is caused by revenue vehicle
- 22 equipment failure that requires assistance from a person other than
- 23 the vehicle operator before the vehicle can be operated normally.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
