- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 552.101, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 552.101. EXCEPTION: CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.
- 8 (a) Information is excepted from the requirements of Section
- 9 552.021 if it is information considered to be confidential by law,
- 10 either constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision.
- 11 (b) The exception to disclosure provided by Subsection (a)
- 12 does not apply to information considered to be:
- 13 (1) privileged under an evidentiary privilege created
- 14 by the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure, the Texas Rules of Evidence,
- 15 the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct, the Federal
- 16 Rules of Evidence, or the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure,
- 17 including the attorney-client privilege, the attorney work product
- 18 privilege, or any other state or federal discovery privilege; or
- 19 (2) excepted from required disclosure under another
- 20 provision of this chapter.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 552.302, Government Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 552.302. FAILURE TO MAKE TIMELY REQUEST FOR ATTORNEY
- 24 GENERAL DECISION; PRESUMPTION THAT INFORMATION IS PUBLIC. (a) If

- 1 a governmental body does not request an attorney general decision
- 2 as provided by Section 552.301 and provide the requestor with the
- 3 information required by Sections 552.301(d) and (e-1), the
- 4 information requested in writing is presumed to be subject to
- 5 required public disclosure and must be released unless there is a
- 6 compelling reason to withhold the information.
- 7 (b) Sections 552.103, 552.104, 552.105, 552.106, 552.108,
- 8 552.111, 552.112, 552.116, 552.122, 552.125, 552.144, 552.146,
- 9 <u>552.153</u>, and <u>552.154</u> do not constitute compelling reasons to
- 10 withhold information under Subsection (a) for a governmental body
- 11 that fails to comply with the requirements of Section 552.301.
- 12 SECTION 3. Section 552.305, Government Code, is amended by
- 13 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 14 <u>(f) A governmental body's failure to comply with the</u>
- 15 requirements of Section 552.301 does not affect another person's
- 16 privacy or property interests or the person's ability under this
- 17 <u>section to submit a letter, memorandum, or brief in support of each</u>
- 18 reason why the information should be withheld.
- 19 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 20 a request for information received by a governmental body on or
- 21 after the effective date of this Act. A request received before the
- 22 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 23 date the request was received, and the former law is continued in
- 24 effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
