3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 120 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 120. TASK FORCE OF BORDER HEALTH OFFICIALS
7	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
8	Sec. 120.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Border region" means the Texas-Mexico border
10	region, as defined by Section 2056.002, Government Code.
11	(2) "Task force" means the Task Force of Border Health
12	Officials.
13	SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES
14	Sec. 120.051. TASK FORCE; DUTIES. (a) The department shall
15	establish the Task Force of Border Health Officials to advise the
16	<pre>commissioner:</pre>
17	(1) on policy priorities addressing major issues
18	affecting the border region residents' health and health
19	<pre>conditions;</pre>
20	(2) on raising public awareness of the issues
21	described by Subdivision (1); and
22	(3) on other health issues impacting the border region
23	as determined by the commissioner, including:
24	(A) barriers to accessing health care;

including:		
	(i) diabetes;

	(iii) heart disease and stroke;	
	(iv) obesity;

The task force shall submit a report of recommendations 9 10 to the commissioner for short-term and long-term border plans, as described by Subchapter C, not later than November 1 of each 11 12 even-numbered year. Sec. 120.052. COLLABORATION WITH THE OFFICE OF BORDER 13 14 HEALTH. The Office of Border Health established under Section 12.071 shall provide staff support to the task force and any other 15 assistance as needed or required by the task force, if practicable. 16 Sec. 120.053. COMPOSITION. (a) The task force is composed 17 of: 18 19 (1) the health department directors appointed under Section 121.033 from: 20 21 (A) each county in the border region; and 22 (B) each municipality in the border region that 23 has a sister city in Mexico; 24 (2) two ex officio nonvoting members who are members

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(A) one of whom is appointed by the lieutenant

1 (B) one of whom is appointed by the speaker of the 2 house of representatives; and 3 (3) additional members appointed by the commissioner. 4 The commissioner shall designate a chair and vice chair 5 of the task force from among the task force members. 6 (c) The members appointed by the lieutenant governor and the 7 speaker of the house of representatives serve three-year terms. Sec. 120.054. MEETINGS. (a) The task force shall meet at 8 least quarterly each fiscal year. Members may hold meetings by 9 conference calls and through videoconference in accordance with 10 Section 551.127, Government Code. 11 12 (b) Section 551.125, Government Code, applies to a meeting held by conference call under this section, except that Section 13 14 551.125(b), Government Code, does not apply. Sec. 120.055. COMPENSATION. A task force member is not 15 entitled to compensation or reimbursement for expenses incurred in 16 17 performing the member's duties. SUBCHAPTER C. BORDER HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN 18 Sec. 120.101. SHORT-TERM AND LONG-TERM PLANS. (a) The task 19 force shall make recommendations to the commissioner for short-term 20 21 and long-term border health improvement plans. The short-term plan 22 shall identify health objectives proposed to be accomplished before the fourth anniversary of the date the plan is adopted. The 23

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long-term plan shall identify health objectives proposed to be

accomplished before the ninth anniversary of the date the plan is

(b) The commissioner shall review the task

- 1 recommendations and, based on those recommendations, recommend
- 2 short-term and long-term border health improvement plans to the
- 3 executive commissioner, identifying specific health objectives
- 4 that may be implemented under existing law.
- 5 (c) The executive commissioner shall adopt short-term and
- 6 long-term border health improvement plans and direct the department
- 7 to implement the portions of the plans that can be implemented
- 8 within existing appropriations under existing law.
- 9 (d) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 10 the executive commissioner shall submit a report detailing the
- 11 actions taken by the task force. The report must include:
- 12 (1) the status of all projects and activities
- 13 involving the health issues described under Section 120.051(a)(3);
- 14 (2) the funding for the expenditures; and
- 15 (3) recommendations for legislation necessary to
- 16 <u>implement the short-term and long-term border health improvement</u>
- 17 plans.
- 18 Sec. 120.102. APPLICATION OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110,
- 19 Government Code, does not apply to the task force.
- Sec. 120.103. ASSISTANCE FROM STATE AGENCIES AND POLITICAL
- 21 SUBDIVISIONS. At the request of the task force, a state agency or
- 22 political subdivision of this state shall cooperate with the task
- 23 force to the greatest extent practicable to fully implement the
- 24 task force's statutory duties.
- 25 SECTION 2. (a) The commissioner of state health services,
- 26 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives
- 27 shall appoint the members of the Task Force of Border Health

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- 1 Officials established by this Act not later than October 1, 2017.
- 2 (b) The initial short-term border health improvement plan
- 3 adopted under Section 120.101, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 4 this Act, must include a border health improvement plan for
- 5 implementation beginning not later than September 1, 2018. The
- 6 Department of State Health Services shall implement the initiatives
- 7 in the short-term border health improvement plan, as directed by
- 8 the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services
- 9 Commission, not later than September 1, 2022.
- 10 (c) The initial long-term border health improvement plan
- 11 adopted under Section 120.101, Health and Safety Code, as added by
- 12 this Act, must include a border health improvement plan for
- 13 implementation beginning not later than September 1, 2020. The
- 14 Department of State Health Services shall implement the initiatives
- 15 in the long-term border health improvement plan, as directed by the
- 16 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission,
- 17 not later than September 1, 2027.
- 18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
