1	AN ACT
2	relating to mosquito control districts established for an urgent
3	public health purpose.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 344, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by designating Sections 344.001 through 344.007 as Subchapter A and
7	adding a subchapter heading to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER A. ESTABLISHMENT, OPERATION, AND DISSOLUTION OF
9	MOSQUITO CONTROL DISTRICTS
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 344, Health and Safety Code, is amended
11	by adding Subchapter B to read as follows:
12	SUBCHAPTER B. ESTABLISHMENT OF MOSQUITO CONTROL DISTRICTS FOR
13	URGENT PUBLIC HEALTH PURPOSE
14	Sec. 344.051. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "department"
15	means the Department of State Health Services.
16	Sec. 344.052. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS. The legislature finds
17	that:
18	(1) scientists have concluded the Zika virus is a
19	cause for microcephaly and other severe fetal brain defects;
20	(2) the department has reported that counties in the
21	Gulf Coast region and on the international border with Mexico are at
22	the highest risk in this state of developing localized cases of the
23	Zika virus;
24	(3) Cameron County, which is located on the

- 1 international border with Mexico, has had as of December 2016 at
- 2 least five documented cases of locally transmitted Zika virus;
- 3 (4) the powers of a mosquito control district may be
- 4 effective in combating the increased risk of transmission of the
- 5 Zika virus; and
- 6 (5) there is an urgent public health purpose for
- 7 establishing a mosquito control district in Cameron and Hidalgo
- 8 Counties and other high-risk counties to contain, eradicate, and
- 9 treat problems associated with communicable diseases, including
- 10 the Zika virus, the dengue virus, and the chikungunya virus, that
- 11 are carried by mosquitoes.
- 12 <u>Sec. 344.053. APPLICABILITY OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter</u>
- 13 applies only to a county located on the international border with
- 14 Mexico:
- 15 (1) for which the department has documented a locally
- 16 transmitted case of the Zika virus; or
- 17 (2) that is adjacent to a county described by
- 18 Subdivision (1).
- 19 Sec. 344.054. ESTABLISHMENT. A county described by Section
- 20 344.053 may establish an urgent public health mosquito control
- 21 district on issuance of an order by the county judge or
- 22 commissioners court of the county stating that an urgent public
- 23 health purpose requires establishment of the district and ordering
- 24 an election under Section 344.001.
- Sec. 344.055. DUTIES OF COUNTY ESTABLISHING DISTRICT. A
- 26 county that establishes an urgent public health mosquito control
- 27 district under this subchapter shall:

1	(1) conduct surveillance of vectors carrying
2	communicable disease;
3	(2) address the capacity of the county public health
4	infrastructure, including by:
5	(A) establishing and operating communicable
6	disease and illness identification laboratories;
7	(B) training and hiring public health personnel
8	and research fellows;
9	(C) matching state, federal, and private
10	initiatives and efforts aimed at addressing and mitigating health
11	and environmental conditions that contribute to the breeding,
12	development, and spread of vectors carrying communicable disease;
13	(D) testing county residents for communicable
14	diseases and providing medical treatment to county residents who
15	have communicable diseases; and
16	(E) funding prevention measures and initiatives
17	to protect county residents from vectors carrying communicable
18	disease; and
19	(3) address the prevention and spread of vectors
20	carrying communicable disease by funding efforts to inform people
21	about the prevention and spread through community campaigns and
22	regional information efforts.
23	Sec. 344.056. SPECIAL PUBLIC HEALTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
24	(a) In this section, "committee" means the special public health
25	advisory committee established under this section.
26	(b) Notwithstanding Section 344.004, the commissioners

- 2 public health advisory committee.
- 3 (c) The commissioners court shall appoint seven members to
- 4 the committee as follows:
- 5 (1) one member who is the county public health

- 8 at the executive director level in the most populated
- 9 municipalities in the county; and
- 10 (3) three members who are property taxpaying voters of
- 11 the county.
- 12 (d) The commissioner of state health services shall appoint
- 13 one delegate to serve as a nonvoting, ex officio member of the
- 14 committee.
- 15 (e) The county judge shall designate one committee member
- 16 appointed under Subsection (c) as the presiding officer of the
- 17 committee. The committee meets at the call of the presiding
- 18 officer.
- 19 (f) A committee member serves without compensation.
- 20 (g) A committee member must take an oath of office
- 21 prescribed by the commissioners court.
- (h) The committee shall:
- 23 (1) make written recommendations to the commissioners
- 24 court that the committee considers necessary to:
- 25 (A) address the urgent public health purpose of
- 26 the mosquito control district established under this subchapter;
- 27 and

(B) implement the district's duties; and
(2) perform any other duty assigned to the committee
by the commissioners court.
Sec. 344.057. MOSQUITO CONTROL PERSONNEL. The
commissioners court of a county that establishes an urgent public
health mosquito control district under this subchapter may appoint:
(1) a mosquito control engineer as provided by Section
344.005; or
(2) any other public health professional the
commissioners court determines is necessary to carry out the duties
of the district and to address the recommendations of the special
public health advisory committee established under Section
344.056.
SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
