5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 434, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Sections 434.212 and 434.213 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 434.212. WOMEN VETERANS REPORT. Not later than
8	November 1 of each even-numbered year, the commission shall submit
9	to the governor, lieutenant governor, and legislature a report on
10	women veterans in this state. The report may be delivered
11	electronically and must:
12	(1) estimate the:
13	(A) number of women veterans in this state;
14	(B) number of women veterans who contact the
15	<pre>commission for assistance; and</pre>
16	(C) number of women veterans who receive
17	assistance from the commission, the Texas Workforce Commission, the
18	Department of State Health Services, and other state agencies;
19	(2) identify the unique problems faced by women
20	veterans; and
21	(3) recommend policy proposals, initiatives, and
22	funding levels to address the problems identified in Subdivision
23	<u>(2).</u>
24	Sec. 434.213. WOMEN VETERANS COMMUNITY OUTREACH CAMPAIGN.

- 1 The women veterans coordinator designated under Section 434.203, in
- 2 consultation with the Governor's Commission for Women, the United
- 3 States Department of Veterans Affairs, and any other appropriate
- 4 agency, shall conduct a community outreach campaign to:
- 5 (1) provide information relating to and increase
- 6 awareness of benefits and services available to women veterans;
- 7 (2) improve access to benefits and services for women
- 8 veterans;
- 9 <u>(3) increase participation of women veterans in</u>
- 10 programs that provide benefits and services;
- 11 (4) provide information on the significant
- 12 contributions of women veterans in this state; and
- 13 <u>(5) provide information relating to and increase</u>
- 14 awareness of support groups and other organizations relating to
- 15 family services, including services for women veterans who are
- 16 single parents.
- SECTION 2. Not later than November 1, 2018, the women
- 18 veterans coordinator shall establish the women veterans community
- 19 outreach campaign as required under Section 434.213, Government
- 20 Code, as added by this Act, and the Texas Veterans Commission shall
- 21 adopt any rules necessary to implement the campaign.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
