2	relating to the requirement of a guardian to provide information
3	regarding a ward's health and residence to certain relatives of the

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Sections 1151.056(a) and (g), Estates Code, are
7	amended to read as follows:
8	(a) This section applies <u>only</u> with respect to <u>a relative</u>
9	[relatives] described under Sections 1101.001(b)(13)(A)-(D):
10	(1) against whom a protective order has not been
11	issued to protect the ward;
12	(2) who has not been found by a court or other state
13	agency to have abused, neglected, or exploited the ward; and
14	(3) who has elected in writing to receive the notice
15	about a ward under this section.
16	(g) In considering a motion under Subsection (e), the court
17	shall relieve the guardian of the duty to provide notice about a
18	ward to a relative under this section if the court finds that:
19	(1) the motion includes a written request from a relative
20	electing to not receive the notice;
21	(2) the guardian was unable to locate the relative after
22	making reasonable efforts to discover and locate the relative;
23	(3) the guardian was able to locate the relative, but was
24	unable to establish communication with the relative after making

1 reasonable efforts to establish communication; or

2 (4) a protective order was issued against the relative to
3 protect the ward;

4 (5) a court or other state agency has found that the 5 relative abused, neglected, or exploited the ward; or

6 (4) [(6)] notice is not in the best interest of the ward.

SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a guardianship created before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.

10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
