A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the eligibility of a firefighter or a peace officer for
3	workers' compensation benefits for post-traumatic stress disorder.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 504, Labor Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 504.019 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 504.019. COVERAGE FOR POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER
8	FOR CERTAIN FIREFIGHTERS AND PEACE OFFICERS. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Firefighter" means an individual employed by a
10	political subdivision of this state who is a firefighter subject
11	to certification by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection under
12	Chapter 419, Government Code, whose principal duties are
13	firefighting and aircraft crash and rescue.
14	(2) "Peace officer" means a person elected, employed,
15	or appointed as a peace officer under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal
16	Procedure, or other law.
17	(3) "Post-traumatic stress disorder" means a disorder
18	that:
19	(A) meets the diagnostic criteria for
20	post-traumatic stress disorder specified by the American
21	Psychiatric Association in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of
22	Mental Disorders, fifth edition, or a later edition adopted by the
23	commissioner of workers' compensation; and
24	(B) results in an impairment of a person's

- 1 functioning in the person's community, employment, family, school,
- 2 or social group.
- 3 (b) Post-traumatic stress disorder suffered by a
- 4 firefighter or peace officer is a compensable injury under this
- 5 <u>subtitle only if:</u>
- 6 (1) the disorder is caused by events occurring in the
- 7 course and scope of the firefighter's or peace officer's
- 8 employment; and
- 9 (2) the preponderance of the evidence indicates that
- 10 the firefighter's or peace officer's work was a substantial
- 11 contributing factor of the disorder.
- 12 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 13 to a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a
- 14 compensable injury that occurs on or after the effective date of
- 15 this Act. A claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before
- 16 that date is governed by the law as it existed on the date the
- 17 compensable injury occurred, and the former law is continued in
- 18 effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
