A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to complaints filed against certain law enforcement
- 3 officers, peace officers, detention officers, county jailers, and
- 4 fire fighters.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 614, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 614.0205 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 614.0205. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 9 (1) "Complaint" means an allegation that a law
- 10 enforcement officer or fire fighter has committed misconduct or has
- 11 violated a policy of the law enforcement agency or fire department
- 12 that appointed or employs the officer or employee.
- 13 (2) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of this
- 14 state or an agency of a political subdivision of this state
- 15 authorized by law to appoint or employ a law enforcement officer.
- 16 (3) "Law enforcement officer" means a peace officer
- 17 under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law or a
- 18 detention officer or county jailer.
- SECTION 2. Section 614.021(a), Government Code, is amended
- 20 to read as follows:
- 21 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), this subchapter
- 22 applies only to a complaint against:
- 23 (1) a law enforcement officer [of the State of Texas,
- 24 including an officer of the Department of Public Safety or of the

1 Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission]; or

- 2 (2) a fire fighter [who is] employed by this state or a
- 3 political subdivision of this state[+
- 4 [(3) a peace officer under Article 2.12, Code of
- 5 Criminal Procedure, or other law who is appointed or employed by a
- 6 political subdivision of this state; or
- 7 [(4) a detention officer or county jailer who is
- 8 appointed or employed by a political subdivision of this state].
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 614.022, Government Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 614.022. COMPLAINT TO BE IN WRITING AND SIGNED BY
- 12 COMPLAINANT. (a) To be considered by the head of a law enforcement
- 13 [state] agency or by the head of a fire department [or local law
- 14 enforcement agency], the complaint must be:
- 15 (1) in writing; [and]
- 16 (2) signed by the person making the complaint; and
- 17 (3) filed with the head of the law enforcement agency
- 18 or fire department, or that person's designee.
- 19 (b) Any person, including a law enforcement officer or an
- 20 employee of a law enforcement agency or fire department, may file a
- 21 complaint under this section.
- 22 SECTION 4. Section 614.023, Government Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- Sec. 614.023. COPY OF COMPLAINT TO BE GIVEN TO OFFICER OR
- 25 EMPLOYEE. (a) A copy of a signed complaint against an officer or
- 26 employee to whom this subchapter applies [a law enforcement officer
- 27 of this state or a fire fighter, detention officer, county jailer,

- 1 or peace officer appointed or employed by a political subdivision
- 2 of this state] shall be given to the officer or employee within a
- 3 reasonable time after the complaint is filed and before the
- 4 complaint is investigated.
- 5 (b) Disciplinary action may not be taken against the officer
- 6 or employee unless a signed complaint against the officer or
- 7 $\underline{\text{employee}}$ is filed and a copy of the [$\underline{\text{signed}}$] complaint is given to
- 8 the officer or employee.
- 9 (c) In addition to the requirement of Subsection (b), the
- 10 officer or employee may not be indefinitely suspended or terminated
- 11 from employment based on the subject matter of the complaint
- 12 unless:
- 13 (1) the complaint is investigated; and
- 14 (2) there is sufficient evidence to prove the
- 15 allegation of misconduct.
- SECTION 5. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 17 to a complaint relating to conduct that occurs on or after the
- 18 effective date of this Act. A complaint relating to conduct that
- 19 occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 20 in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law is
- 21 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 22 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
