Section 42.0175(a), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 (a) A license issued under this chapter, other than a 7 lifetime resident hunting license or a nonresident five-day special hunting license, is valid for one year from the last day of the 8 9 month in which the license is issued [only during the yearly period for which the license is issued without regard to the date on which 10 a license is acquired. Each yearly period begins on September 1 or 11 12 on another date set by the commission and extends through August 31 of the next year or another date set by the commission. A license 13 14 issued under this chapter other than a nonresident five-day special hunting license that is issued before September 1 or another date 15

date of issuance through August 31 of the following year or another 18 date set by the commission. The commission by rule may set the 19

- 24 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
