- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 3105, Government Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 3105. TEXAS PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL MONUMENT AND CEREMONY
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 3105.002, Government Code, is amended by
- 10 adding Subdivision (2-a) to read as follows:
- 11 (2-a) "Committee" means the Texas Peace Officers'
- 12 Memorial Ceremony Committee.
- SECTION 3. Section 3105.005(c), Government Code, is amended
- 14 to read as follows:
- 15 (c) Money in the account may be used only for the purposes
- 16 prescribed by Section 3105.004 [this chapter].
- 17 SECTION 4. Chapter 3105, Government Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Sections 3105.006 and 3105.007 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 3105.006. TEXAS PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL CEREMONY
- 20 COMMITTEE. (a) The committee is established to plan, oversee, and
- 21 <u>facilitate</u> annual ceremonies recognizing and honoring peace
- 22 officers of this state who were killed in the line of duty.
- 23 (b) The committee consists of the following members:
- 24 (1) a president, or the president's designee, of any

2	(A) provides full service legal and political			
3	representation to law enforcement officers of this state;			
4	(B) has at least 10,000 members paying dues, as			
5	provided by the organization's Internal Revenue Service Form 990			
6	for the previous reporting period;			
7	(C) has complied with all filing requirements of			
8	the Internal Revenue Service, the United States Department of			
9	Labor, and the secretary of state; and			
10	(D) has an elected board of directors;			
11	(2) a surviving spouse of a peace officer killed in the			
12	line of duty selected by the chapters of the Concerns of Police			
13	Survivors of this state; and			
14	(3) the following nonvoting members or designees of			
15	the members:			
16	(A) the governor;			
17	(B) the lieutenant governor;			
18	(C) the speaker of the house of representatives;			
19	(D) the attorney general;			
20	(E) the director of the Department of Public			
21	Safety;			
22	(F) the executive director of the board; and			
23	(G) the executive director of the commission.			
24	Sec. 3105.007. TEXAS PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL CEREMONY.			
25	(a) The committee shall meet as necessary to plan and coordinate			
26	an annual memorial ceremony on the Capitol grounds to honor Texas			
27	peace officers who were killed in the line of duty.			

- 1 (b) The committee shall hold the ceremony on a date selected
- 2 by the committee during the week in which May 8 occurs.
- 3 (c) The ceremony may be funded by public or private money.
- 4 (d) Each odd-numbered year, the ceremony must include:
- 5 (1) a parade of law enforcement color guards and
- 6 personnel ending at the Capitol; and
- 7 (2) a ceremony held during a joint session of the
- 8 legislature on the floor of the house of representatives, if
- 9 possible.
- 10 (e) During the ceremony under this section, the name of each
- 11 peace officer who is being added to the monument that year must be
- 12 read and the surviving family members of the peace officer must be
- 13 <u>recognized.</u>
- 14 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
