5	SECTION 1. Section 501.003, Occupations Code, is amended to

7	Sec. 501.003. <u>DEFINITION:</u> PRACTICE OF PSYCHOLOGY. (a) In

13	methods, and procedures for the purpose of:

17	undesired behavior;
18	(b) emotional, interpersonal,
19	learning, substance use, neuropsychological, cognitive, or
20	behavioral disorders or disabilities, including those that
21	accompany medical problems; or
22	(c) mental illness;
23	(ii) evaluating, assessing, or
24	facilitating, by a license holder or a person who represents the

person to the public by a title or description of services that 1 2 includes the word "psychological," "psychologist," or "psychology," the enhancement of individual, group, 3 Οľ organizational effectiveness, including evaluating, assessing, or 4 5 facilitating: (a) personal effectiveness; 6 7 (b) adaptive behavior; (c) interpersonal relationships; 8 academic, vocational, and life 9 (d) 10 adjustment; 11 (e) health; or 12 (f) _individual, group, οr 13 organizational performance; (iii) <u>providing</u> 14 psychological, 15 neuropsychological, and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, and 16 remediation as well as counseling, psychoanalysis, psychotherapy, hypnosis, and biofeedback; or 17 18 (iv) consulting with others, including other mental health professionals, physicians, school personnel, 19 20 or organizations within the scope of the provider's competency and training with respect to services provided for a specific 21 individual; or 22 23 (B) the supervision of an activity or service 24 described by Paragraph (A). 25 (2) "Psychological <u>"psychological</u>] [section, services" means acts or behaviors that are included within the 26 27 purview of the practice of psychology.

- 1 (b) A person is engaged in the practice of psychology 2 [within the meaning of this chapter] if the person:
- 3 (1) when providing or offering to provide
- 4 psychological services to another in a professional relationship,
- 5 represents the person to the public by a title or description of
- 6 services that includes the word "psychological," "psychologist,"
- 7 or "psychology";
- 8 (2) provides or offers to provide psychological
- 9 services to individuals, groups, organizations, or the public <u>in a</u>
- 10 professional relationship;
- 11 (3) is a psychologist or psychological associate
- 12 employed as described by Section 501.004(a)(1) who offers or
- 13 provides psychological services, other than lecture services, to
- 14 the public for consideration separate from the salary that person
- 15 receives for performing the person's regular duties; or
- 16 (4) is employed as a psychologist or psychological
- 17 associate by an organization that sells psychological services,
- 18 other than lecture services, to the public for consideration.
- 19 (c) A person is not engaged in the [The] practice of
- 20 psychology based solely on the person offering, regardless of
- 21 whether the person is solicited, advice, counsel, or guidance
- 22 addressing or affecting the mental, emotional, or behavioral health
- 23 of another, if the person does not represent that the person is
- 24 <u>licensed under this chapter or engaged in the delivery of</u>
- 25 psychological services and does not represent that the advice,
- 26 counsel, or guidance is psychological in nature, and:
- 27 (1) the advice, counsel, or guidance is not offered in
