A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the fixed tuition price plan offered by certain general 3 academic teaching institutions.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 54.017, Education Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (c-1) and (c-2) to 7 read as follows:

8 (c) The governing board of an institution to which this 9 section applies shall offer entering undergraduate students, 10 including undergraduate students who transfer to the institution, 11 the opportunity to participate in a fixed tuition price plan under 12 which the institution, subject to any restrictions or 13 gualifications adopted by the governing board, agrees:

14 (1) not to increase tuition charges per semester 15 credit hour for a participating student for at least the first <u>18</u> 16 [12] consecutive semesters that occur after the date of the 17 student's initial enrollment at any public or private institution 18 of higher education, regardless of whether the student enrolls at 19 any institution in those semesters; and

(2) to provide to any student participating in the fixed tuition price plan:

(A) a rebate of tuition charges, in an amount prescribed by the institution, if the student is awarded a baccalaureate degree by the institution within four calendar years

1 after the date of the student's initial enrollment at any public or 2 private institution of higher education; and (B) a rebate of tuition charges, in an amount 3 prescribed by the institution that is less than the rebate amount 4 prescribed under Paragraph (A), if the student does not qualify for 5 a rebate under Paragraph (A) and is awarded a baccalaureate degree 6 by the institution within five calendar years after the date of the 7 8 student's initial enrollment at any public or private institution of higher education. 9 10 (c-1) An institution to which this section applies shall provide to each entering undergraduate student, at the time the 11 student is offered the opportunity to participate in 12 the institution's fixed tuition price plan, detailed information 13 regarding the tuition rebates offered by the institution under 14 Subsection (c)(2), including the amounts of those rebates [, and 15

16 subject to any restrictions or qualifications adopted by the 17 governing board].

18 (c-2) For purposes of this section, one or more summer terms 19 occurring in the same summer is considered a semester.

SECTION 2. Section 54.017, Education Code, as amended by 20 this Act, applies beginning with fixed tuition price plans offered 21 to entering students at general academic teaching institutions for 22 the 2018 fall semester. Fixed tuition price plans offered to 23 24 entering students at general academic teaching institutions for a semester or term before the 2018 fall semester are governed by the 25 26 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. 27
