6	SECTION 1. Section 12.104(b), Education Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	(b) An open-enrollment charter school is subject to:
9	(1) a provision of this title establishing a criminal

12	applicable, imposed by this title or a rule adopted under this
13	title, relating to:

16	this subchapter as determined by the commissioner;

- 5 (c) A school district or public junior college district
- 6 shall report the results of the safety and security audit conducted
- 7 under Subsection (b) to the district's board of trustees and, in the
- 8 manner required by the Texas School Safety Center, to the Texas
- 9 School Safety Center. A school district shall also report the
- 10 results to the agency.
- 11 (e) A school district shall include in its multihazard
- 12 <u>emergency operations plan:</u>
- 13 (1) a chain of command that designates the individual
- 14 <u>responsible for making final decisions during a disaster or</u>
- 15 <u>emergency situation and identifies other individuals responsible</u>
- 16 for making those decisions if the designated person is unavailable;
- 17 (2) provisions for responding to a natural disaster,
- 18 active shooter, and any other dangerous scenario identified for
- 19 purposes of this section by the agency or the Texas School Safety
- 20 Center;
- 21 (3) provisions for ensuring the safety of students in
- 22 portable buildings;
- 23 (4) provisions for providing immediate notification
- 24 to parents, guardians, and other persons standing in parental
- 25 relation in circumstances involving a significant threat to the
- 26 health or safety of students, including identification of the
- 27 individual with responsibility for overseeing the notification;

- 2 (5) a statement of the amount per student expended by
- 3 the district on school safety.
- 4 SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 5 amended by adding Section 37.1083 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 37.1083. AGENCY DUTIES REGARDING SCHOOL SAFETY
- 7 MEASURES. (a) The agency, with assistance from the Texas School
- 8 Safety Center, shall adopt a model multihazard emergency operations
- 9 plan that school districts may use in developing district-specific
- 10 multihazard emergency operations plans as required by Section
- 11 37.108.
- 12 (b) The agency shall adopt a cycle for the agency's review
- 13 and approval of school district multihazard emergency operations
- 14 plans adopted under Section 37.108. The cycle must be organized so
- 15 that every six months the agency reviews the plans of approximately
- 16 <u>one-fourth of the school districts in this state.</u>
- 17 <u>(c) A school district shall:</u>
- 18 (1) submit its multihazard emergency operations plan
- 19 to the agency in accordance with the cycle adopted under Subsection
- 20 (b); and
- 21 (2) provide any additional information required by the
- 22 agency in connection with the agency's review of the plan.
- 23 (d) The agency shall post information on the agency's
- 24 Internet website that identifies each school district that:
- 25 <u>(1) failed to submit the district's multihazard</u>
- 26 emergency operations plan for agency review and approval in
- 27 accordance with the cycle adopted under Subsection (b);

1	(2) submitted a multihazard emergency operations plan
2	that did not comply with an applicable standard; or
3	(3) failed the school safety and security audit
4	required to be conducted under Section 37.108(b).
5	(e) The agency shall maintain a list of school safety
6	service providers approved by the agency.
7	(f) The commissioner may adopt rules necessary to implement
8	this section.
9	SECTION 4. Section 37.109, Education Code, is amended by
10	adding Subsections (a-1), (c), and (d) and amending Subsection (b)
11	to read as follows:
12	(a-1) The committee must include:
13	(1) a representative of a local fire department,
14	emergency services agency, or other emergency services provider;
15	(2) a representative of a local police department;
16	(3) a representative of a municipality with territory
17	included within the boundaries of the district;
18	(4) the president of the district's board of trustees;
19	(5) a member of the district's board of trustees other
20	than the president;
21	(6) the district's superintendent; and
22	(7) two additional members designated by the
23	district's superintendent.
24	(b) The committee shall:
25	(1) participate on behalf of the district in
26	developing and implementing emergency plans consistent with the

district multihazard emergency operations plan required by Section

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- 1 37.108(a) to ensure that the plans reflect specific campus,
- 2 facility, or support services needs;
- 3 (2) periodically provide recommendations regarding
- 4 updating the district multihazard emergency operations plan
- 5 required by Section 37.108(a) in accordance with best practices
- 6 identified by the agency, the Texas School Safety Center, or a
- 7 school safety service provider on the list maintained by the agency
- 8 under Section 37.1083(e);
- 9 (3) provide the district with any campus, facility, or
- 10 support services information required in connection with a safety
- 11 and security audit required by Section 37.108(b), a safety and
- 12 security audit report required by Section 37.108(c), or another
- 13 report required to be submitted by the district to the Texas School
- 14 Safety Center; and
- 15  $\underline{(4)}$  [ $\overline{(3)}$ ] review each report required to be submitted
- 16 by the district to the Texas School Safety Center to ensure that the
- 17 report contains accurate and complete information regarding each
- 18 campus, facility, or support service in accordance with criteria
- 19 established by the center.
- 20 (c) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, the
- 21 <u>committee shall meet at least once during each academic semester</u>
- 22 and at least once during the summer. A committee established by a
- 23 school district that operates schools on a year-round system or in
- 24 accordance with another alternative schedule shall meet at least
- 25 three times during each calendar year, with an interval of at least
- 26 two months between each meeting.
- 27 (d) The committee is subject to Chapter 551, Government

- 1 Code. Notice of a committee meeting must be posted in the same
- 2 manner as notice of a meeting of the district's board of trustees.
- 3 SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 4 amended by adding Section 37.112 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 37.112. NOTIFICATION REGARDING BOMB THREAT OR
- 6 TERRORISTIC THREAT. A school district that receives a bomb threat
- 7 or terroristic threat relating to a campus or other district
- 8 facility at which students are present shall provide notification
- 9 of the threat as soon as possible to the parent or guardian of or
- 10 other person standing in parental relation to each student who is
- 11 assigned to the campus or who regularly uses the facility, as
- 12 applicable.
- 13 SECTION 6. Section 37.207, Education Code, is amended by
- 14 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 (b) Each school district shall report the results of its
- 17 audits to:
- 18 (1) the center in the manner required by the center;
- 19 and
- 20 (2) the agency, in accordance with commissioner rule.
- 21 (c) The agency shall provide assistance to the center in
- 22 developing the model safety and security audit procedure.
- SECTION 7. Not later than January 1, 2018, the Texas School
- 24 Safety Center shall:
- 25 (1) develop a list of best practices for ensuring the
- 26 safety of public school students receiving instruction in portable
- 27 buildings; and

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- 1 (2) provide information regarding the list of best
- 2 practices to school districts using portable buildings for student
- 3 instruction.
- 4 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
