5	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 25.904 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 25.904. STUDENT NEWSPAPER. (a) In this section,
8	"protected speech" means speech protected by the First Amendment to
9	the United States Constitution or by Section 8, Article I, Texas
10	Constitution.
11	(b) The board of trustees of a school district shall adopt a
12	policy providing for freedom of the press for students who publish a
13	student newspaper as part of a journalism, newspaper, yearbook, or

- writing course or club, regardless of whether the newspaper is published using the district's money, equipment, or facilities.
- (c) The policy must: 16

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- 17 (1) permit students to determine the content of the newspaper, so long as the content constitutes protected speech; 18
- 19 (2) prohibit the school district or any employee of the district from censoring protected speech or from punishing a 20
- 21 student for engaging in protected speech; and
- (3) limit the scope and duration of a district 22
- 23 employee's review of the newspaper before publication only to what
- 24 is reasonably necessary to:

- 1 (A) determine whether the newspaper contains
- 2 content other than protected speech; and
- 3 (B) if appropriate, remove content other than
- 4 protected speech from the newspaper.
- 5 (d) The publication of a student newspaper may not be
- 6 unreasonably delayed for purposes of conducting a review described
- 7 by Subsection (c)(3).
- 8 (e) An employee of a school district may not be subjected to
- 9 disciplinary action or any other form of punishment or retaliation
- 10 for acting to protect or refusing to infringe upon a student's
- 11 rights as provided by this section.
- 12 (f) The commissioner shall adopt rules as necessary to
- 13 implement this section, including rules establishing a process for
- 14 a student to appeal a school district employee's removal of content
- 15 from a student newspaper.
- SECTION 2. Section 12.104(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (b) An open-enrollment charter school is subject to:
- 19 (1) a provision of this title establishing a criminal
- 20 offense; and
- 21 (2) a prohibition, restriction, or requirement, as
- 22 applicable, imposed by this title or a rule adopted under this

- 3 school year.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
