5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 4, Special District Local Laws
7	Code, is amended by adding Chapter 3955 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 3955. MONTGOMERY COUNTY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 3955.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.
12	(2) "County" means Montgomery County.
13	(3) "Director" means a board member.
14	(4) "District" means the Montgomery County
15	Improvement District No. 1.
16	Sec. 3955.002. CREATION AND NATURE OF DISTRICT. The
17	district is a special district created under Section 59, Article
18	XVI, Texas Constitution.
19	Sec. 3955.003. PURPOSE; DECLARATION OF INTENT. (a) The
20	creation of the district is essential to accomplish the purposes of
21	Sections 52 and 52-a, Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI,
22	Texas Constitution, and other public purposes stated in this
23	chapter. By creating the district and in authorizing the county and
24	other political subdivisions to contract with the district, the

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S.B. No. 2293 1 legislature has established a program to accomplish the public purposes set out in Section 52-a, Article III, Texas Constitution. 2 (b) The creation of the district is necessary to promote, 3 develop, encourage, and maintain employment, commerce, 4 5 transportation, housing, tourism, recreation, the arts, entertainment, economic development, safety, and 6 the public 7 welfare in the district. 8 (c) This chapter and the creation of the district may not be interpreted to relieve the county from providing the level of 9 services provided as of the effective date of the Act enacting this 10 chapter to the area in the district. The district is created to 11 12 supplement and not to supplant county services provided in the 13 district. 14 Sec. 3955.004. FINDINGS OF BENEFIT AND PUBLIC PURPOSE. (a) 15 The district is created to serve a public use and benefit. 16 (b) All land and other property included in the district 17 will benefit from the improvements and services to be provided by the district under powe<u>rs conferred by Sections 52 and 52-a,</u> 18 Article III, and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and 19 other powers granted under this chapter. 20 21 (c) The creation of the district is in the public interest 22 and is essential to further the public purposes of: (1) developing and diversifying the economy of the 23 24 state; (2) eliminating unemployment and underemployment; and 25 26 (3) developing or expanding transportation and 27 commerce.

1	(d) The district will:
2	(1) promote the health, safety, and general welfare of
3	residents, employers, potential employees, employees, visitors,
4	and consumers in the district, and of the public;
5	(2) provide needed funding for the district to
6	preserve, maintain, and enhance the economic health and vitality of
7	the district territory as a community and business center;
8	(3) promote the health, safety, welfare, and enjoyment
9	of the public by providing pedestrian ways and by landscaping and
10	developing certain areas in the district, which are necessary for
11	the restoration, preservation, and enhancement of scenic beauty;
12	and
13	(4) provide for water, wastewater, drainage, road,
14	rail, and recreational facilities for the district.
15	(e) Pedestrian ways along or across a street, whether at
16	grade or above or below the surface, and street lighting, street
17	landscaping, parking, and street art objects are parts of and
18	necessary components of a street and are considered to be a street
19	or road improvement.
20	(f) The district will not act as the agent or
21	instrumentality of any private interest even though the district
22	will benefit many private interests as well as the public.
23	Sec. 3955.005. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The
24	district is initially composed of the territory described by
25	Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter.
26	(b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of
27	the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake in the

No. 2293 1 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process 2 does not affect the district's: 3 (1) organization, existence, or validity; 4 (2) right to issue any type of bonds for the purposes 5 for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and 6 interest on the bonds; 7 (3) right to impose or collect an assessment or tax; or 8 (4) legality or operation. 9 Sec. 3955.006. APPLICABILITY OF MUNICIPAL MANAGEMENT DISTRICTS LAW. Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, 10 Chapter 375, Local Government Code, applies to the district. 11 12 Sec. 3955.007. CONSTRUCTION OF CHAPTER. This chapter shall be liberally construed in conformity with the findings and purposes 13 14 stated in this chapter. 15 SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS 16 Sec. 3955.051. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district is governed by a board of five voting directors who serve staggered 17 terms of four years, with two or three directors' terms expiring 18 19 June 1 of each odd-numbered year. (b) The board by resolution may change the number of voting 20 directors on the board if the board determines that the change is in 21 the best interest of the district. The board may not consist of 22 23 fewer than 5 or more than 15 directors. 24 (c) Section 49.052, Water Code, does not apply to the 25 directors. 26 Sec. 3955.052. APPOINTMENT OF VOTING DIRECTORS. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality shall appoint voting directors 27

1	from persons recommended by the board.
2	Sec. 3955.053. NONVOTING DIRECTORS. The board may appoint
3	nonvoting directors to serve at the pleasure of the voting
4	directors.
5	Sec. 3955.054. QUORUM. For purposes of determining the
6	requirements for a quorum of the board, the following are not
7	counted:
8	(1) a board position vacant for any reason, including
9	death, resignation, or disqualification;
10	(2) a director who is abstaining from participation in
11	a vote because of a conflict of interest; or
12	(3) a nonvoting director.
13	Sec. 3955.055. COMPENSATION. A director is entitled to
14	receive fees of office and reimbursement for actual expenses as
15	provided by Section 49.060, Water Code. Sections 375.069 and
16	375.070, Local Government Code, do not apply to the board.
17	Sec. 3955.056. INITIAL VOTING DIRECTORS. (a) The initial
18	board consists of the following directors:

25	(b) Of the initial directors, the terms of directors
26	appointed for positions one through three expire June 1, 2019, and
27	the terms of directors appointed for positions four and five expire

## 1 June 1, 2021. 2 (c) Section 3955.052 does not apply to this section. 3 (d) This section expires September 1, 2021. SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES 4 5 Sec. 3955.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for 6 7 which the district is created. 8 Sec. 3955.102. IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND SERVICES. The district may provide, design, construct, acquire, improve, 9 relocate, operate, maintain, or finance an improvement project or 10 service using any money available to the district, or contract with 11 12 a governmental or private entity to provide, design, construct, acquire, improve, relocate, operate, maintain, or finance an 13 improvement project or service authorized under this chapter or 14 15 Chapter 375, Local Government Code. Sec. 3955.103. DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION POWERS. The 16 17 district, using money available to the district, may exercise the powers given to a development corporation under Chapter 505, Local 18 19 Government Code, including the power to own, operate, acquire, 20 construct, lease, improve, or maintain a project under that 21 chapter. Sec. 3955.104. NONPROFIT CORPORATION. (a) The board by 22 resolution may authorize the creation of a nonprofit corporation to 23 24 assist and act for the district in implementing a project or providing a service authorized by this chapter. 25 26 (b) The nonprofit corporation: 27 (1) has each power of and is considered to be a local

1 government corporation created under Subchapter D, Chapter 431, Transportation Code; and 2 3 (2) may implement any project and provide any service authorized by this chapter. 4 5 (c) The board shall appoint the board of directors of the nonprofit corporation. The board of directors of the nonprofit 6 7 corporation shall serve in the same manner as the board of directors of a local government corporation created under Subchapter D, 8 Chapter 431, Transportation Code, except that a board member is not 9 10 required to reside in the district. Sec. 3955.105. PUBLIC FACILITY CORPORATIONS. As provided 11 12 by Chapter 303, Local Government Code, the board by resolution may authorize the creation of a public facility corporation in the 13 district to finance or to provide for the acquisition, 14 15 construction, rehabilitation, renovation, repair, equipping, furnishing, or placement in service of public facilities in an 16 17 orderly, planned manner and at the lowest possible borrowing costs. Sec. 3955.106. AGREEMENTS; GRANTS. (a) As provided by 18 Chapter 375, Local Government Code, the district may make an 19 agreement with or accept a gift, grant, or loan from any person. 20 21 (b) The implementation of a project is a governmental function or service for the purposes of Chapter 791, Government 22 23 Code. 24 Sec. 3955.107. LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES. To protect the public interest, the district may contract with a qualified party, 25 26 including the county, to provide law enforcement services in the district for a fee. 27

1 Sec. 3955.108. MEMBERSHIP IN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. The 2 district may join and pay dues to a charitable or nonprofit organization that performs a service or provides an activity 3 consistent with the furtherance of a district purpose. 4 Sec. 3955.109. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. (a) The district may 5 engage in activities that accomplish the economic development 6 7 purposes of the district. 8 (b) The district may establish and provide for the administration of one or more programs to promote state or local 9 economic development and to stimulate business and commercial 10 activity in the district, including programs to: 11 12 (1) make loans and grants of public money; and (2) provide dist<u>rict personnel and services.</u> 13 14 (c) The district may create economic development programs 15 and exercise the economic development powers provided to 16 municipalities by: 17 (1) Chapter 380, Local Government Code; and (2) Subchapter A, Chapter 1509, Government Code. 18 19 Sec. 3955.110. PARKING FACILITIES. (a) The district may acquire, lease as lessor or lessee, construct, develop, own, 20 operate, and maintain parking facilities or a system of parking 21 facilities, including lots, garages, parking terminals, or other 22 structures or accommodations for parking motor vehicles off the 23 24 streets and related appurtenances. 25 (b) The district's parking facilities serve the public 26 purposes of the district and are owned, used, and held for a public purpose even if leased or operated by a private entity for a term of 27

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1 years.

2 <u>(c) The district's parking facilities are parts of and</u> 3 <u>necessary components of a street and are considered to be a street</u> 4 <u>or road improvement.</u>

5 (d) The development and operation of the district's parking
6 facilities may be considered an economic development program.

Sec. 3955.111. ROAD UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS. The district
 has the powers provided by the general laws relating to road utility
 districts created under Section 52(b), Article III, Texas
 Constitution and Chapter 441, Transportation Code.

Sec. 3955.112. STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT. The district may negotiate and enter into a written strategic partnership agreement under Section 43.0751, Local Government Code, with a municipality in whose extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located.

16 <u>Sec. 3955.113. ANNEXATION OR EXCLUSION OF LAND. (a) The</u> 17 <u>district may annex land as provided by Subchapter J, Chapter 49,</u> 18 <u>Water Code.</u>

(b) The district may exclude land as provided by Subchapter
 J, Chapter 49, Water Code. Section 375.044(b), Local Government
 Code, does not apply to the district.

22 <u>Sec. 3955.114. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may</u> 23 <u>not exercise the power of eminent domain.</u>

<u>SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS; ASSESSMENTS</u>
 <u>Sec. 3955.151. DISBURSEMENTS AND TRANSFERS OF MONEY. The</u>
 <u>board by resolution shall establish the number of directors'</u>
 <u>signatures and the procedure required for a disbursement or</u>

1 transfer of district money. 2 Sec. 3955.152. MONEY USED FOR IMPROVEMENTS OR SERVICES. 3 The district may acquire, construct, finance, operate, or maintain any improvement or service authorized under this chapter or Chapter 4 375, Local Government Code, using any money available to the 5 6 district. 7 Sec. 3955.153. PETITION REQUIRED FOR FINANCING SERVICES AND IMPROVEMENTS WITH ASSESSMENTS. (a) The board may not finance a 8 service or improvement project with assessments under this chapter 9 10 unless a written petition requesting that service or improvement has been filed with the board. 11 12 (b) A petition filed under Subsection (a) must be signed by the owners of a majority of the assessed value of real property in 13 the district subject to assessment according to the most recent 14 certified tax appraisal roll for the county. 15 Sec. 3955.154. METHOD OF NOTICE FOR HEARING. The district 16 may mail the notice required by Section 375.115(c), Local 17 Government Code, by certified or first-class United States mail. 18 19 The board shall determine the method of notice. 20 Sec. 3955.155. ASSESSMENTS; LIENS FOR ASSESSMENTS. (a) The board by resolution may impose and collect an assessment for any 21 22 purpose authorized by this chapter in all or any part of the 23 district. 24 (b) An assessment, a reassessment, or an assessment resulting from an addition to or correction of the assessment roll 25 26 by the district, penalties and interest on an assessment or reassessment, an expense of collection, and reasonable attorney's 27

1	fees incurred by the district:
2	(1) are a first and prior lien against the property
3	assessed;
4	(2) are superior to any other lien or claim other than
5	a lien or claim for county, school district, or municipal ad valorem
6	taxes; and
7	(3) are the personal liability of and a charge against
8	the owners of the property even if the owners are not named in the
9	assessment proceedings.
10	(c) The lien is effective from the date of the board's
11	resolution imposing the assessment until the date the assessment is
12	paid. The board may enforce the lien in the same manner that the
13	board may enforce an ad valorem tax lien against real property.
14	(d) The board may make a correction to or deletion from the
15	assessment roll that does not increase the amount of assessment of
16	any parcel of land without providing notice and holding a hearing in
17	the manner required for additional assessments.
18	Sec. 3955.156. RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY NOT EXEMPT. Section
19	375.161, Local Government Code, does not apply to the district.
20	Sec. 3955.157. COMPETITIVE BIDDING. Subchapter I, Chapter
21	49, Water Code, applies to the district. Sections 375.221 and
22	375.223, Local Government Code, do not apply to the district.
23	Sec. 3955.158. TAX AND ASSESSMENT ABATEMENTS. The district
24	may designate reinvestment zones and may grant abatements of
25	district taxes or assessments on property in the zones.
26	SUBCHAPTER E. TAXES AND BONDS
27	Sec. 3955.201. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES AND BONDS. (a)

1	The district may issue, without an election, bonds, notes, and
2	other obligations secured by:
3	(1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or
4	(2) contract payments described by Section 3955.203.
5	(b) The district must hold an election in the manner
6	provided by Subchapter L, Chapter 375, Local Government Code, to
7	obtain voter approval before the district may impose an ad valorem
8	tax or issue bonds payable from ad valorem taxes.
9	(c) Section 375.243, Local Government Code, does not apply
10	to the district.
11	(d) All or any part of any facilities or improvements that
12	may be acquired by a district by the issuance of its bonds may be
13	submitted as a single proposition or as several propositions to be
14	voted on at the election.
15	Sec. 3955.202. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If
16	authorized by a majority of the district voters voting at an
17	election held in accordance with Section 3955.201, the district may
18	impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable property in the
19	district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water Code, for any
20	district purpose, including to:
21	(1) maintain and operate the district;
22	(2) construct or acquire improvements; or
23	(3) provide a service.
24	(b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
25	exceed the rate approved at the election.
26	(c) Section 49.107(h), Water Code, does not apply to the
27	district.

Sec. 3955.203. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters voting at an election held for that purpose.

7 (b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a
8 provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by
9 the board without further voter approval.

Sec. 3955.204. AUTHORITY TO BORROW MONEY AND TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. (a) The district may borrow money on terms determined by the board. Section 375.205, Local Government Code, does not apply to a loan, line of credit, or other borrowing from a bank or financial institution secured by revenue other than ad valorem taxes.

16 (b) The district may issue bonds, notes, or other 17 obligations payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, 18 assessments, impact fees, revenue, contract payments, grants, or 19 other district money, or any combination of those sources of money, 20 to pay for any authorized district purpose.

21 <u>Sec. 3955.205. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district</u> 22 <u>issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the</u> 23 <u>board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing</u> 24 <u>direct annual ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount,</u> 25 <u>for each year that all or part of the bonds are outstanding as</u> 26 <u>required and in the manner provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602,</u> 27 Water Code.

1	Sec. 3955.206. BONDS FOR RECREATIONAL FACILITIES. The
2	limitation on the outstanding principal amount of bonds, notes, and
3	other obligations provided by Section 49.4645, Water Code, does not
4	apply to the district.
5	SUBCHAPTER F. DEFINED AREAS
6	Sec. 3955.251. AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH DEFINED AREAS OR
7	DESIGNATED PROPERTY. The district may define areas or designate
8	certain property of the district to pay for improvements,
9	facilities, or services that primarily benefit that area or
10	property and do not generally and directly benefit the district as a
11	whole.
12	Sec. 3955.252. PROCEDURE FOR ELECTION. (a) Before the
13	district may impose an ad valorem tax or issue bonds payable from ad
14	valorem taxes of the defined area or designated property, the board
15	shall hold an election in the defined area or in the designated
16	property only.
17	(b) The board may submit the issues to the voters on the same
18	ballot to be used in another election.
19	Sec. 3955.253. DECLARING RESULT AND ISSUING ORDER. (a) If
20	a majority of the voters voting at the election approve the
21	proposition or propositions, the board shall declare the results
22	and, by order, shall establish the defined area and describe it by
23	metes and bounds or designate the specific property.
24	(b) A court may not review the board's order except on the
25	ground of fraud, palpable error, or arbitrary and confiscatory
26	abuse of discretion.
27	Sec. 3955.254. TAXES FOR SERVICES, IMPROVEMENTS, AND

1 FACILITIES IN DEFINED AREAS OR DESIGNATED PROPERTY. On voter 2 approval and adoption of the order described by Section 3955.253, 3 the district may apply separately, differently, equitably, and specifically its taxing power and lien authority to the defined 4 area or designated property to provide money to construct, 5 administer, maintain, and operate services, improvements, and 6 7 facilities that primarily benefit the defined area or designated 8 property. 9 Sec. 3955.255. ISSUANCE OF BONDS FOR DEFINED AREA OR 10 DESIGNATED PROPERTY. After the order under Section 3955.253 is adopted, the district may issue bonds to provide for any land, 11 12 improvements, facilities, plants, equipment, and appliances for 13 the defined area or designated property. 14 SUBCHAPTER G. SALES AND USE TAX 15 Sec. 3955.301. MEANINGS OF WORDS AND PHRASES. A word or phrase used in this subchapter that is defined by Chapters 151 and 16 17 321, Tax Code, has the meaning assigned by Chapters 151 and 321, Tax 18 Code. 19 Sec. 3955.302. APPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN TAX CODE PROVISIONS. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this subchapter, 20 Subtitles A and B, Title 2, Tax Code, and Chapter 151, Tax Code, 21 22 apply to taxes imposed under this subchapter and to the administration and enforcement of those taxes in the same manner 23 24 that those laws apply to state taxes. (b) Chapter 321, Tax Code, relating to municipal sales and 25 26 use taxes, applies to the application, collection, change, and 27 administration of a sales and use tax imposed under this subchapter

No. 2293 1 to the extent consistent with this chapter, as if references in 2 Chapter 321, Tax Code, to a municipality referred to the district 3 and references to a governing body referred to the board. 4 (c) Sections 321.106, 321.401, 321.402, 321.403, 321.404, 321.406, 321.409, 321.506, 321.507, and 321.508, Tax Code, do not 5 apply to a tax imposed under this subchapter. 6 7 Sec. 3955.303. AUTHORIZATION; ELECTION. (a) The district 8 may adopt a sales and use tax to serve the purposes of the district after an election in which a majority of the voters of the district 9 10 voting in the election authorize the adoption of the tax. 11 (b) The board by order may call an election to authorize a 12 sales and use tax. The election may be held with any other district 13 election. 14 (c) The district shall provide notice of the election and 15 shall hold the election in the manner prescribed by Section 16 3955.201. 17 (d) The ballots shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "Authorization of a sales and use tax 18 19 in the Montgomery County Improvement District No. 1 at a rate not to exceed \_\_\_\_ percent." 20 21 Sec. 3955.304. ABOLISHING SALES AND USE TAX. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), the board may abolish the sales and use 22 23 tax without an election. 24 (b) The board may not abolish the sales and use tax if the district has outstanding debt secured by the tax. 25 26 Sec. 3955.305. SALES AND USE TAX RATE. (a) On adoption of

27 the tax authorized by this subchapter, a tax is imposed on the

No. 2293 receipts from the sale at retail of taxable items in the district 1 and an excise tax is imposed on the use, storage, or other 2 consumption in the district of taxable items purchased, leased, or 3 rented from a retailer during the period that the tax is in effect. 4 5 (b) The board shall determine the rate of the tax, which may be in one-eighth of one percent increments not to exceed the maximum 6 7 rate authorized by the district voters at the election. The board may lower the tax rate to the extent the rate does not impair any 8 outstanding debt or obligations payable from the tax. 9 10 (c) The rate of the excise tax is the same as the rate of the sales tax portion of the tax and is applied to the sales price of the 11 12 taxable item. 13 SUBCHAPTER H. DISSOLUTION AND MUNICIPAL ANNEXATION 14 Sec. 3955.351. MUNICIPAL ANNEXATION; DISSOLUTION. (a) The 15 district is a "water or sewer district" under Section 43.071, Local 16 Government Code. 17 (b) Section 43.075, Local Government Code, applies to the 18 district. 19 (c) Section 375.264, Local Government Code, does not apply to the dissolution of the district by a municipality. 20 21 SECTION 2. The Montgomery County Improvement District No. 1 initially includes all territory contained in the following area: 22 [[[Boundaries to be determined]]] 23 24 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this 25 26 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies, 27

officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
 Government Code.

4 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
5 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
6 Environmental Quality.

7 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed 8 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, 9 lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives 10 within the required time.

(d) The general law relating to consent by political subdivisions to the creation of districts with conservation, reclamation, and road powers and the inclusion of land in those districts has been complied with.

(e) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act have been fulfilled and accomplished.

19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
