Sec. 3955.103. DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION POWERS. The district, using money available to the district, may exercise the

powers given to a development corporation under Chapter 505, Local Government Code, including the power to own, operate, acquire, construct, lease, improve, or maintain a project under that chapter.

3955.104. NONPROFIT CORPORATION. (a) The board by resolution may authorize the creation of a nonprofit corporation to assist and act for the district in implementing a project or providing a service authorized by this chapter.
(b) The nonprofit corporation:

(1) has each power of and is considered to be a local government corporation created under Subchapter D, Chapter 431, Transportation Code; and

(2) may implement any project and provide any service authorized by this chapter.

Sec. 3955.107. LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES. To protect the public interest, the district may contract with a qualified party, including the county, to provide law enforcement services in the district for a fee.

Sec. 3955.108. MEMBERSHIP IN CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS. The district may join and pay dues to a charitable or nonprofit organization that performs a service or provides an activity

consistent with the furtherance of a district purpose.

Sec. 3955.109. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. (a) The district may engage in activities that accomplish the economic development

purposes of the district.

- (b) The district <u>and</u> provide may establish administration of one or more programs to promote state or local economic development and to stimulate business and commercial activity in the district, including programs to:
  - (1) make loans and grants of public money; and (2) provide district personnel and services.
- The district may create economic development programs (c) and exercise the economic development powers provided to municipalities by:
  - (1) Chapter 380, Local Government Code; and

(2) Subchapter A, Chapter 1509, Government Code.

Sec. 3955.110. PARKING FACILITIES. (a) The district may acquire, lease as lessor or lessee, construct, develop, own, operate, and maintain parking facilities or a system of parking facilities, including lots, garages, parking terminals, or other structures or accommodations for parking motor vehicles off the streets and related appurtenances.

(b) The district's parking facilities serve the public purposes of the district and are owned, used, and held for a public purpose even if leased or operated by a private entity for a term of

The district's parking facilities are parts of necessary components of a street and are considered to be a street or road improvement.

(d) The development and operation of the district's parking

facilities may be considered an economic development program.

(d) All or any part of any facilities or improvements that may be acquired by a district by the issuance of its bonds may be submitted as a single proposition or as several propositions to be voted on at the election.

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. authorized by a majority of the district voters voting at an election held in accordance with Section 3955.201, the district may impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable property in the district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water Code, for any district purpose, including to:

  (b) The board may not
- abolish the sales and use tax if the district has outstanding debt secured by the tax.
- Sec. 3955.305. SALES AND USE TAX RATE. (a) On adoption of the tax authorized by this subchapter, a tax is imposed on the receipts from the sale at retail of taxable items in the district and an excise tax is imposed on the use, storage, or other consumption in the district of taxable items purchased, leased, or rented from a retailer during the period that the tax is in effect.
- (b) The board shall determine the rate of the tax, which may be in one-eighth of one percent increments not to exceed the maximum rate authorized by the district voters at the election. The board may lower the tax rate to the extent the rate does not impair any outstanding debt or obligations payable from the tax.
- (c) The rate of the excise tax is the same as the rate of the tax portion of the tax and is applied to the sales price of the taxable item.
