WHEREAS, The gymnastics team of Texas Woman's University reached the pinnacle of success by placing first at the 2017 USA Gymnastics Women's Collegiate National Championships, held April 7 through 9 in Seattle, Washington; and

WHEREAS, After finishing in second place in the semifinal round of the team competition, the Pioneers advanced to the finals, where they faced the University of Bridgeport, Lindenwood University, and Cornell University; with the national title on the line, five Texas Woman's University athletes set or matched their career-high scores, and the team came from behind to clinch the crown in the final rotation with its solid performance in the vault; with an overall team score of 196.125, the Pioneers set a new school record for most total points, and the win marked the 10th national championship for the gymnastics program and its first since 2008; and

WHEREAS, Seven Pioneer gymnasts also took part in the individual event finals; they were paced by Mallory Moredock and Schyler Jones, who finished second and fourth, respectively, in the vault, and Alyssa Kelly, who was sixth in the balance beam; and
