**IN RE:** **HB340** by Goldman (Relating to abolishing shampoo apprentice permits and shampoo specialty certificates.), **As Introduced**

<b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>
---

The bill would abolish shampoo apprentice permits and shampoo specialty certificates. The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) and Comptroller of Public Accounts estimate this would result in a revenue loss to the state General Revenue Fund of approximately \$2,700 per fiscal year.

Based on the analysis of TDLR, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
