**IN RE: HB1756** by Neave ( Relating to the establishment of one or more supplemental county civil service commissions in certain counties.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

<p><b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b></p>

The bill would amend the Local Government Code allowing a commissioners court of a county that has a population of more than two million and is adjacent to a county with a population of more than one million and has established a civil service system to establish one or more supplemental commissions to assist in administering the civil service system. The Office of Court Administration anticipates no significant fiscal impact to the state court system, or to local courts, from the provisions of the bill.

The bill would take effect immediately if the bill receives a two-thirds vote in each house; otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2017.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
