IN RE: HB1787 by Wray (Relating to the execution of a declaration for mental health treatment.),
As Engrossed

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Civil Practices and Remedies Code allowing the declaration for mental health treatment to be signed by the principal and acknowledge before a notary public.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2017

Local Government Impact
