**IN RE:** **HB2468** by Davis, Sarah (relating to a study on the assessments used by the Board of Pardons and Paroles to make parole decisions.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

<p><b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b></p>
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The bill would amend the Government Code to require the Board of Pardons and Paroles (BPP) to conduct a study on the effectiveness of the assessment components of the parole guidelines. The bill would require BPP to submit a report to certain offices no later than January 1, 2019. According to BPP, any additional work resulting from the provisions of the bill could be reasonably absorbed within current resources.

**Local Government Impact**
