**IN RE:** **HB3426** by Laubenberg (Relating to the use of habitual toll violator remedies by certain toll project entities.), **As Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Transportation Code granting certain counties authority to pursue habitual toll violators.

The bill would take effect immediately if it receives a two-thirds vote in each house; otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2017.

**Local Government Impact**

According to the Texas Association of Counties and Fort Bend County, no fiscal impact is anticipated.
