IN RE: SB504 by Taylor, Van (relating to lobbying by former members of the legislature; creating an offense.), **Committee Report 2nd House, Substituted**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Government Code to prohibit former legislative members from lobbying before the first anniversary of the first day of the first regular legislative session to convene after the person ceases to be a member. The bill would take effect January 8, 2019.

Local Government Impact

A Class B misdemeanor is punishable by a fine of not more than \$2,000, confinement in jail for a term not to exceed 180 days, or both. Costs associated with enforcement, prosecution and confinement could likely be absorbed within existing resources. Revenue gain from fines imposed and collected is not anticipated to have a significant fiscal implication.
