IN RE: SB610 by Huffines (Relating to a study on expanding the state virtual school network.),

As Engrossed

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Education Code to require the Texas Education Agency (TEA), using existing resources, to conduct a study regarding the feasibility of offering a full-time electronic course program for a grade level at or above kindergarten and below grade three; the study to address certain elements; and the agency to submit a report on the result of the study to certain entities not later than September 1, 2018.

TEA indicates some costs associated with contracting with a third-party for the required study; however, this analysis assumes that the study could be accomplished with existing agency resources.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
