IN RE: SB632 by Buckingham (Relating to the repeal of certain state procurement advisory and approval procedures.), **As Introduced**

No fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend Chapter 2155 of the Government Code, regarding general rules and procedures for purchasing, to repeal Sections 2155.086 (procedures for awarding certain contracts) and 2155.087 (Statewide Procurement Advisory Council).

The bill would take effect September 1, 2017.

The Governor's Office, the Texas Facilities Commission, the Comptroller of Public Accounts and the Department of Information Resources indicate that the bill would have no fiscal impact on the State.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
