**IN RE: SB1051** by Watson (Relating to the accommodation of a deaf or hard of hearing student in driver education; authorizing a fee.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would require the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation to offer a driver education course online in American Sign Language, and establish a fee for the course. The fee may not exceed the cost of creating and administering the course.

The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation indicates it could absorb the costs associated with the bill within its current resources; therefore, any revenue from the fee would be minimal.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
