IN RE: SB1386 by Taylor, Van (Relating to the use of habitual toll violator remedies by certain toll project entities.), As Introduced

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Transportation Code granting certain counties authority to pursue habitual toll violators.

The bill would take effect immediately if it receives a two-thirds vote in each house; otherwise, the bill would take effect September 1, 2017.
