**IN RE:** **SB1498** by Zaffirini (Relating to the regulation of temporary common worker employers.), **As Introduced**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would amend the Labor Code relating the regulation of temporary common worker employers.

The bill would repeal the requirement that temporary common worker employers hold a state issued license to operate. The Department of Licensing and Regulation estimates this would result in a revenue loss of approximately \$3,700 per year.

The agency also indicates there would be a minimal net savings associated with implementing the provisions of the bill.

**Local Government Impact**

According to the Texas Municipal League, the fiscal impact to municipalities to implement the provisions of the bill is not anticipated to be significant.
