The Chair introduced Mayor Ron Nirenberg of the City of San Antonio, who welcomed the Committee.

The chair laid out the first interim charge of the hearing: *Military Installation: Identify* opportunities to promote the strategic importance of military installations in Texas. Study the impact of the Aviation, Aerospace, & Defense manufacturing industry on the economic vitality of

Chairwoman Campbell opened invited testimony on the interim charge. Witnesses testifying are shown on the attached list.

The Chair laid out the second interim charge of the hearing: *Military Youth Readiness: Evaluate the current readiness and fitness of Texas youth for entering military service over the next 5-10 years. Identify any additional economic impact to the state should youth not meet physical requirements or required academic performance.*
