Pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, this is to give notice of intent to introduce in the 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, a bill to be entitled "An Act relating to the powers and duties of Meyer Ranch Municipal Utility District of Comal County; providing authority to issue bonds and impose taxes." The bill would require that the Meyer Ranch Municipal Utility District of Comal County (the "District") obtain the consent of the Commissioners Court of Comal County prior to exercising the power of eminent domain. The bill would also give the District the powers of a road district under Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution; and the authority to issue bonds for road projects and to levy taxes for payment of such bonds. The District is not located in the extraterritorial jurisdiction or corporate boundaries of any municipality, and is located within the unincorporated lands of Comal County, Texas.


