7	must have an efficient whistle or other sound-producing device if

11	(a) All canoes, kayaks, punts, rowboats, sailboats, rubber
12	rafts, and other paddle craft when paddled, poled, oared, or
13	windblown are exempt from all safety equipment requirements except
14	each vessel must have the following:
15	(1) one Coast Guard approved wearable personal
16	flotation device for each person aboard; [and]
17	(2) the lights prescribed by the commandant of the
18	Coast Guard for vessels and required under Section 31.064; and
19	(3) the sound-producing device prescribed by the
20	commandant of the Coast Guard for vessels and required under
21	<u>Section 31.065</u> .

21	operator or any similarly equipped passenger on the motorboat.
22	(b) A motorboat operator may not operate a motorboat less
23	than 26 feet in length and equipped by the manufacturer with an

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend a portion of the Parks and Wildlife Code to require all vessels to have a whistle or other sound producing device prescribed by the Coast Guard. The bill exempts this provision from the penalties imposed upon those who fail to comply with other safety equipment requirements.

The bill would also amend the Parks and Wildlife Code relating to the operation of a motorboat under 26 feet long with a manufacturer-installed engine cutoff switch. The bill would require those operating such boats to ensure that the switch is operational and that the attachment or wireless transmitter that engages the cutoff switch is attached or properly functioning.

The Parks and Wildlife Department indicates that duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.

The bill would take effect immediately upon receiving a two-thirds majority vote of the members in both houses; otherwise it would take effect on September 1, 2017.
