17	SECTION 2. Section 572.032(a-1), Government Code, as
18	amended by this Act, applies to a financial statement filed under
19	Subchapter B, Chapter 572, Government Code, regardless of whether
20	the statement was required to be filed before, on, or after the
21	effective date of this Act.
22	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
23	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
24	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
