A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 755.001(17), Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended to read as follows:
6	(17) "Portable [power] boiler" means a boiler
7	primarily intended for use at a temporary location.
8	SECTION 2. Section 755.022(a), Health and Safety Code, is
9	amended to read as follows:
LO	(a) This chapter does not apply to:
L1	(1) boilers owned or operated by the federal
L2	government;
L3	(2) pressure vessels or process steam generators,
L4	other than steam collection or liberation drums of process steam
L5	generators;
L6	(3) manually fired miniature boilers that:
L7	(A) are constructed or maintained for
L8	locomotives, boats, tractors, or stationary engines only as a hobby
L9	for exhibition, recreation, education, or historical purposes and
20	not for commercial use;
21	(B) have an inside diameter of 12 inches or less
22	or a grate area of two square feet or less; and
23	(C) are equipped with a safety valve of adequate
24	size, a water level indicator, and a pressure gauge:

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- 1 (4) boilers that are designed for operation only at
- 2 atmospheric pressure and that are equipped with two independent
- 3 means to prevent the buildup of pressure; [ex]
- 4 (5) steam cookers; or
- 5 <u>(6) espresso machines</u>.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 755.025(e), Health and Safety Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (e) The commission by rule shall establish the subsequent
- 9 intervals and manner of inspection for a [A] portable [power]
- 10 boiler [must be inspected externally each time the boiler is moved
- 11 to a new location and must receive an internal inspection at least
- 12 annually].
- 13 SECTION 4. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 14 of this Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall
- 15 adopt the rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by
- 16 this Act.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

Amend H.B. No. 3257 (senate committee report) by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION ____. Chapter 755, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subchapter E to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER E. REGULATION OF BOILERS AND FUEL GAS SYSTEMS

Sec. 755.071. RESTRICTION ON REGULATION. Notwithstanding any other law, a state agency or political subdivision may not restrict the use or installation of a specific fuel gas pipe product that is approved for use and installation by the International Fuel Gas Code.

Sec. 755.072. CONFLICT OF LAW. To the extent of a conflict between this subchapter and another law, this subchapter controls.
