Re: Responsibility of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) Pursuant to Article XVI, Section 59(d), Texas Constitution.

Senate Bill (SB) 625, as Filed by Senator Birdwell, et al.-relating to the Nueces River Authority, following the recommendations of the Sunset Advisory Commission.

Dear Governor Patrick:

The following comments are provided pursuant to the Constitutional requirements referenced above. Under those requirements, the TCEQ must submit, to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the House of Representatives, the TCEQ's recommendations on specific legislation affecting water districts. We recommend that these comments be considered in the evaluation of the proposed legislation.

The bill provides changes to the Nueces River Authority (NRA), Acts of the 44th Texas Legislature, First Called Session, Chapter 427 to provide for gubernatorial designation of the presiding officer, requiring board member training, separating duties of staff from the board, requiring public testimony to be included in each board meeting agenda, requiring maintenance of complaint information, and to promote alternative dispute resolution. NRA will develop a five year strategic plan for NRA's goals, mission, and anticipated activities and subject to the Texas Water Code (TWC) Chapter 5, 7, 17, 26, and 30 and Texas Health and Safety Code Chapter 366 pertaining to on-site sewage disposal systems. NRA's next Sunset review will occur during 2031.



A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the Nueces River Authority, following recommendations
3 of the Sunset Advisory Commission.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sections 1.02(6), (7), (8), and (9), Chapter
6 427, Acts of the 44th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, are
7 amended to read as follows:

8 (6) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on
9 Environmental Quality [~~Water Rights Commission~~].

10 (7) [~~"Quality board" means the Texas Water Quality~~
11 ~~Board.~~]

12 [~~(8)~~] "Development board" means the Texas Water
13 Development Board.

14 (8) [~~(9)~~] "Waste" means sewage, industrial waste,
15 municipal waste, recreational waste, agricultural waste, waste
16 heat, solid waste, or any other waste.

17 SECTION 2. Section 1.02A(a), Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
18 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended to read as
19 follows:

20 (a) The authority is subject to review under Chapter 325,
21 Government Code (Texas Sunset Act), but may not be abolished under
22 that chapter. The review shall be conducted under Section 325.025,
23 Government Code, as if the authority were a state agency scheduled
24 to be abolished September 1, 2031 [~~2019~~], and every 12th year after

1 that year.

2 SECTION 3. Section 2.02(c), Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
3 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended to read as
4 follows:

5 (c) If the directors find any land included in the field
6 notes other than land in San Patricio, Nueces, and Jim Wells
7 counties, which is not actually included in the watershed of the
8 Nueces River, the board shall exclude the land from the authority
9 and file a certificate of exclusion with the county clerk of the
10 county in which the land is located. The certificate of exclusion
11 shall describe the boundaries of the land excluded so that the land
12 remaining in the authority may be adequately identified.

13 SECTION 4. Section 2.03(i), Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
14 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended to read as
15 follows:

16 (i) The governor shall designate a member of the board as
17 the president of the board to serve in that capacity at the pleasure
18 of the governor. The board shall elect [~~a president,~~] one or more
19 vice-presidents, a secretary, a treasurer, and such other officers
20 as the members of the board may determine in the bylaws or
21 otherwise. The [~~president,~~] vice-presidents, secretary, and
22 treasurer shall be members of the board, but other officers need not
23 be members of the board. The offices of secretary and treasurer may
24 be combined, as may the offices of assistant secretary and
25 assistant treasurer.

26 SECTION 5. Subchapter 2, Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
27 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended by adding Section

1 2.03A to read as follows:

2 Sec. 2.03A. DIRECTOR TRAINING. (a) A person who is
3 appointed to and qualifies for office as a director may not vote,
4 deliberate, or be counted as a director in attendance at a board
5 meeting until the person completes a training program that complies
6 with this section.

7 (b) The training program must provide the person with
8 information regarding:

9 (1) the law governing authority operations;

10 (2) the programs, functions, rules, and budget of the
11 authority;

12 (3) the scope of and limitations on the rulemaking
13 authority of the authority;

14 (4) the results of the most recent formal audit of the
15 authority;

16 (5) the requirements of:

17 (A) laws relating to open meetings, public
18 information, administrative procedure, and disclosure of conflicts
19 of interest; and

20 (B) other laws applicable to members of the
21 governing body of a river authority in performing their duties; and

22 (6) any applicable ethics policies adopted by the
23 authority or the Texas Ethics Commission.

24 (c) A person appointed to the board is entitled to
25 reimbursement for the travel expenses incurred in attending the
26 training program regardless of whether the attendance at the
27 program occurs before or after the person qualifies for office.

1 (d) The executive director shall create a training manual
2 that includes the information required by Subsection (b) of this
3 section. The executive director shall distribute a copy of the
4 training manual annually to each director. Each director shall
5 sign and submit to the executive director a statement acknowledging
6 that the director has received the training manual.

7 SECTION 6. Section 2.05, Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
8 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended by amending
9 Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

10 (a) A director is entitled to receive an allowance in an
11 amount not exceeding that provided under Section 49.060, Water Code
12 ~~[general law of the State of Texas and reimbursement for actual and~~
13 ~~necessary expenses incurred.~~

14 ~~[(1) for each day he spends attending meetings of the~~
15 ~~board, and~~

16 ~~[(2) for each day he spends attending to the business~~
17 ~~of the authority which is authorized by the board].~~

18 (c) In all areas of conflict with this section, Section
19 49.060, Water Code, takes precedence.

20 SECTION 7. Subchapter 2, Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
21 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended by adding
22 Sections 2.06A and 2.08A to read as follows:

23 Sec. 2.06A. PUBLIC TESTIMONY. (a) The board shall develop
24 and implement policies that provide the public with a reasonable
25 opportunity to appear before the board and to speak on any issue
26 under the jurisdiction of the authority.

27 (b) At each regular meeting of the board, the board shall

1 include public testimony as a meeting agenda item and allow members
2 of the public to comment on other agenda items and other matters
3 under the jurisdiction of the authority. The board may not
4 deliberate on or decide a matter not included in the meeting agenda,
5 except that the board may discuss including the matter on the agenda
6 for a subsequent meeting.

7 Sec. 2.08A. SEPARATION OF POLICY AND MANAGEMENT
8 RESPONSIBILITIES. The board shall develop and implement policies
9 that clearly separate the policymaking responsibilities of the
10 board and the management responsibilities of the executive director
11 and the staff of the authority.

12 SECTION 8. Sections 3.02, 3.05, and 3.08, Chapter 427, Acts
13 of the 44th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, are amended to
14 read as follows:

15 Sec. 3.02. (a) Subject to the provisions of the
16 constitution and statutes of the state and the continuing right of
17 supervision of the state through the commission, the Nueces River
18 Authority has and may exercise authority and power over the storm
19 water and floodwater of the Nueces River Basin, subject to the
20 applicable provisions of Chapters 5, 11, and 12 [~~6~~], Water Code [~~as~~
21 ~~amended~~].

22 (b) Subject to Chapters 5, 11, and 12 [~~6~~], Water Code, [~~as~~
23 ~~amended~~,] the authority may exercise the powers of control and
24 employment of the state's water in the manner and for the particular
25 purposes as follows:

26 (1) to provide for the control and coordination of
27 water use in the Nueces River Basin as a unit;

1 (2) to provide by adequate organization and
2 administration for the preservation of the rights of the people of
3 the different sections of the river basin in the beneficial use of
4 water;

5 (3) to provide for conserving storm, flood, and
6 unappropriated flow water of the Nueces River Basin, including the
7 storing, controlling, transporting, treating, and distributing of
8 such water, and the prevention of the escape of any such water
9 without the maximum of public service and for the prevention of
10 devastation of land from recurrent overflows, and the protection of
11 life and property in the river basin from uncontrolled floodwater;

12 (4) to provide for the conservation of water essential
13 for domestic and other water uses of the people of the Nueces River
14 Basin, including all necessary water supplies for cities, towns,
15 and industrial districts;

16 (5) to provide for the irrigation of land in the Nueces
17 River Basin where irrigation is required for agricultural purposes
18 or may be deemed helpful to more profitable agricultural production
19 and for the equitable distribution of storm, flood, and
20 unappropriated flow water to the regional potential requirements
21 for all uses; all plans and all works provided by the authority and
22 all works which may be provided under authorization of the
23 authority should have primary regard to the necessary and potential
24 needs for water, by or within the respective areas constituting the
25 watershed of the Nueces River and its tributary streams;

26 (6) to provide for the encouragement and development
27 of drainage systems and provisions for drainage of land in the

1 valleys of the Nueces River and its tributary streams needing
2 drainage for profitable agricultural and livestock production and
3 industrial activities and drainage of other land in the watershed
4 area of the authority requiring drainage for the most advantageous
5 use;

6 (7) to provide for the conservation of all soils
7 against destructive erosion, thereby preventing the increased
8 flood menace incident thereto;

9 (8) to control and make available for employment,
10 flood, storm, and unappropriated flow water as may be authorized by
11 the commission, in the development of commercial and industrial
12 enterprises in all sections of the watershed area of the authority;

13 (9) to provide as set forth by Chapters 5, 11, and 12
14 [6], Water Code, [~~as amended,~~] for the control, storing, and
15 employment of flood, storm, and unappropriated flow water in the
16 development and distribution of hydroelectric power, where this use
17 may be economically coordinated with other and superior uses, and
18 subordinated to the uses declared by law to be superior; and

19 (10) to provide in the manner set forth in Chapters 5,
20 11, and 12 [6], Water Code, [~~as amended,~~] for each and every purpose
21 and use for which flood, storm, and unappropriated flow water when
22 controlled and conserved may be utilized in the performance of a
23 useful service as contemplated and authorized by the provisions of
24 the constitution and statutes.

25 (c) Subject to Chapters 5, 11, and 12 [6], Water Code, [~~as~~
26 ~~amended,~~] the authority may control, store, and preserve the water
27 of the Nueces River and its tributaries within the boundaries of the

1 authority for any useful purpose, and may use, distribute, and sell
2 the water for any beneficial purpose inside and outside the
3 authority, and may acquire water and water rights inside and
4 outside the authority.

5 Sec. 3.05. (a) The authority has and may exercise all of
6 the powers vested in river authorities under Chapters 5, 7, 17, 26,
7 and 30, [Chapter 21 of the] Water Code, [as amended,] and Chapter
8 366, Health and Safety Code [25 of the Water Code, as amended].

9 (b) The authority is authorized to perform the licensing and
10 other functions authorized to be delegated to local governments by
11 the commission [quality board] in connection with the regulation of
12 private sewage facilities under Chapter 366, Health and Safety
13 [Section 21.083, Water] Code.

14 (c) The authority may serve as the entity to provide
15 regional or area-wide waste collection, treatment, and disposal
16 services, as provided in Subchapter C [D], Chapter 26 [21], Water
17 Code.

18 Sec. 3.08. In the manner provided by Chapters 5, 11, and 12
19 [6], Water Code, the [as amended, the authority shall apply for any
20 permits, licenses, franchises, and other grants of authority it may
21 require from the commission. The] authority may apply for any
22 permits, licenses, franchises, and other grants of authority it may
23 require from the commission [quality board], the development board,
24 or any other federal, state, or local governmental agencies in
25 exercising its powers and accomplishing the purposes under this
26 Act.

27 SECTION 9. Section 3.15(i), Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th

1 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended to read as
2 follows:

3 (i) The provisions of this section do not prohibit the
4 authority from purchasing or acquiring land or interests in land
5 from any person, or from acquiring, constructing, or improving
6 pollution control or waste collection and disposal facilities in
7 accordance with Chapter 30 [~~25~~], Water Code, [~~as amended,~~] the
8 Clean Air Financing Act (Chapter 4477-5a, Vernon's Texas Civil
9 Statutes), or other applicable statutes, or purchasing or acquiring
10 surplus property from any governmental entity by negotiated
11 contract and without necessity for advertising for bids.

12 SECTION 10. Subchapter 3, Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
13 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended by adding Section
14 3.18A to read as follows:

15 Sec. 3.18A. ALTERNATIVE RULEMAKING AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION
16 PROCEDURES. (a) The board shall develop a policy to encourage the
17 use of:

18 (1) negotiated rulemaking procedures under Chapter
19 2008, Government Code, for the adoption of authority rules; and

20 (2) appropriate alternative dispute resolution
21 procedures under Chapter 2009, Government Code, to assist in the
22 resolution of internal and external disputes under the authority's
23 jurisdiction.

24 (b) The authority's procedures relating to alternative
25 dispute resolution must conform, to the extent possible, to any
26 model guidelines issued by the State Office of Administrative
27 Hearings for the use of alternative dispute resolution by state

1 agencies.

2 (c) The authority shall:

3 (1) coordinate the implementation of the policy
4 adopted under Subsection (a) of this section;

5 (2) provide training as needed to implement the
6 procedures for negotiated rulemaking or alternative dispute
7 resolution; and

8 (3) collect data concerning the effectiveness of those
9 procedures.

10 SECTION 11. Sections 3.22A and 3.23, Chapter 427, Acts of
11 the 44th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, are amended to read
12 as follows:

13 Section 3.22A. CONSERVATION PROGRAM. The board shall adopt
14 and implement a program of water conservation that incorporates the
15 practices, techniques, and technologies that will reduce the
16 consumption of water, reduce the loss or waste of water, improve the
17 efficiency in the use of water, or increase the recycling and reuse
18 of water so that a water supply is made available for future or
19 alternative uses and that the commission and development board
20 determine [~~Texas Department of Water Resources determines~~] will
21 meet reasonably anticipated local needs and conditions.

22 Sec. 3.23. The authority has and may exercise all the powers
23 vested in political subdivisions under Chapters 5, 16, and 17
24 [~~Chapter 11~~], Water Code, [~~as amended~~], including [~~without~~
25 ~~limitation~~] the powers necessary to enable the authority to
26 participate in:

27 (1) [the] programs administered by the development

1 board for:

2 (A) the acquisition and development of
3 facilities; []

4 (B) the sale or lease of facilities; and []

5 (C) financial assistance to political
6 subdivisions; [] and

7 (2) other programs as are now or may hereafter be
8 authorized.

9 SECTION 12. Subchapter 3, Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
10 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended by adding
11 Sections 3.27 and 3.28 to read as follows:

12 Sec. 3.27. COMPLAINTS. (a) The authority shall maintain a
13 system to promptly and efficiently act on complaints filed with the
14 authority. The authority shall maintain information about the
15 parties to and subject matter of the complaint, a summary of the
16 results of the review or investigation of the complaint, and the
17 disposition of the complaint.

18 (b) The authority shall make information available
19 describing its procedures for complaint investigation and
20 resolution.

21 (c) The authority shall periodically notify the complaint
22 parties of the status of the complaint until final disposition.

23 Sec. 3.28. FIVE-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN. (a) The authority
24 shall adopt and promptly publish on the authority's Internet
25 website a written, five-year strategic plan that:

26 (1) sets the authority's goals for the following five
27 years;

1 (2) establishes the authority's mission; and
2 (3) describes the anticipated activities that the
3 authority will perform in the Nueces River Basin over the following
4 five years.

5 (b) The authority shall update the five-year strategic plan
6 regularly and publish the updated versions of the plan on the
7 authority's Internet website.

8 SECTION 13. Section 5.01(a), Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
9 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is amended to read as
10 follows:

11 (a) For the purpose of carrying out any power or authority
12 conferred by this Act, including [~~the expense of~~] preparing the
13 master plan and [~~the~~] payment of engineering and related [~~other~~]
14 expenses [~~in connection with this~~], the authority may issue its
15 bonds in three general classes:

16 (1) bonds secured by ad valorem taxes;

17 (2) bonds secured by a pledge of all or part of the
18 revenues accruing to the authority, including without limitation
19 those received from sale of water or other products, rendition of
20 service, tolls, charges, and from all other sources other than ad
21 valorem taxes;

22 (3) bonds secured by a combination pledge of all or
23 part of the revenues described in Subdivision (2) of this
24 subsection, and taxes.

25 SECTION 14. Section 2, Chapter 699, Acts of the 64th
26 Legislature, Regular Session, 1975, is amended to read as follows:

27 Sec. 2. The rights, privileges, authority, and functions

1 herein granted to the authority and the authority itself are
2 expressly subject to Chapters 5, 7, 17 [~~6~~], and 26 [~~24~~], Water Code,
3 and Chapter 366, Health and Safety Code.

4 SECTION 15. Section 5.03, Chapter 427, Acts of the 44th
5 Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, is repealed.

6 SECTION 16. (a) The term of the president of the board of
7 directors of the Nueces River Authority serving on the effective
8 date of this Act expires September 1, 2019. The director serving as
9 president on the effective date of this Act may continue to serve on
10 the board of directors until the expiration of that director's
11 term.

12 (b) Not later than September 2, 2019, the governor shall
13 designate a director as president of the board of directors of the
14 Nueces River Authority as required by Section 2.03(i), Chapter 427,
15 Acts of the 44th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, as amended
16 by this Act.

17 SECTION 17. (a) Notwithstanding Section 2.03A, Chapter
18 427, Acts of the 44th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1935, as
19 added by this Act, a person serving on the board of directors of the
20 Nueces River Authority may vote, deliberate, and be counted as a
21 director in attendance at a meeting of the board until December 1,
22 2019.

23 (b) This section expires January 1, 2020.

24 SECTION 18. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
25 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
26 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
27 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,

1 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
2 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
3 Government Code.

4 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
5 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
6 Environmental Quality.

7 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
8 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
9 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
10 representatives within the required time.

11 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
12 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
13 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
14 and accomplished.

15 SECTION 19. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
