Re: Responsibility of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) Pursuant to Article XVI, Section 59(d), Texas Constitution

Senate Bill (SB) 2526, as Filed by Senator Paul Bettencourt - Relating to the powers and duties of the Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 379; providing authority to issue bonds.

Dear Governor Patrick:

The following comments are provided pursuant to the Constitutional requirements referenced above. Under those requirements, the TCEQ must submit, to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the House of Representatives, the TCEQ's recommendations on specific legislation affecting water districts. We recommend that these comments be considered in the evaluation of the proposed legislation.

This bill codifies Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 379 (District) as Chapter 8045, Special Districts Local Laws Code. This bill grants the District road powers. The bill specifies that at the time of issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of real property in the District. House Bill 1677 by Representative Calanni is the companion to this bill.



A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the powers and duties of the Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 379; providing authority to issue bonds.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 8045 to read as follows:

CHAPTER 8045. HARRIS COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 379

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 8045.0101. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "district" means the Harris County Municipal Utility District No. 379.

Sec. 8045.0102. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT.

(a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit.

(b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of:

(1) a municipal utility district as provided by general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution; and

(2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation, or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.

SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES

Sec. 8045.0201. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may design, acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve, operate, maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a municipality for

1 operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or  
2 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.

3 Sec. 8045.0202. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A  
4 road project must meet all applicable construction standards,  
5 zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each  
6 municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial  
7 jurisdiction the road project is located.

8 (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits  
9 or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road  
10 project must meet all applicable construction standards,  
11 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which  
12 the road project is located.

13 (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the  
14 Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and  
15 specifications of the road project.

16 SUBCHAPTER C. BONDS

17 Sec. 8045.0301. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of  
18 issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations  
19 issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad  
20 valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the  
21 real property in the district.

22 SECTION 2. (a) The legal notice of the intention to  
23 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this  
24 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a  
25 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,  
26 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished  
27 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,

1 Government Code.

2 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has  
3 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on  
4 Environmental Quality.

5 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed  
6 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the  
7 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of  
8 representatives within the required time.

9 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this  
10 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect  
11 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled  
12 and accomplished.

13 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
17 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.


