FLOOR AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_

Amend C.S.H.B. No. 2 (house committee printing) as follows:

(1) On page 55, lines 22-23, strike "If a majority of the voters reject the proposed tax rate," and substitute "If less than 60 percent of the voters voting at the election accept the proposed tax rate,".

(2) On page 55, line 25, strike "rollback" and substitute "lesser of the no-new-revenue tax rate or rollback".

(3) On page 58, lines 13-14, strike "If a majority of the voters reject the proposed tax rate," and substitute "If less than 60 percent of the voters voting at the election accept the proposed tax rate,".

(4) On page 58, line 16, strike "rollback" and substitute "lesser of the no-new-revenue tax rate or rollback".

(5) On page 70, line 9, strike "a majority" and substitute "at least 60 percent [~~a majority~~]".

(6) Strike page 70, lines 17 through 18, and substitute the following:

taxing unit for the current tax year that exceeds the lesser of the following rates:

(1) the taxing unit's no-new-revenue tax rate; or

(2) the taxing unit's rollback tax rate.

(7) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumber the SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION \_\_\_\_ . Section 26.08(c), Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:

(c) If at least 60 percent [~~a majority~~] of the votes cast in the election favor the proposition, the tax rate for the current year is the rate that was adopted by the governing body.

(8) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and renumber the SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

SECTION \_\_\_\_ . Section 26.08(d), Tax Code, is amended to read as follows:

(d) If the proposition is not approved as provided by Subsection (c), the governing body may not adopt a tax rate for the school district for the current year that exceeds the lesser of the following rates:

- (1) the school district's no-new-revenue tax rate; or
- (2) the school district's rollback tax rate.
