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- Amend C.S.H.B. No. 1504 (house committee printing) by adding
- 2 the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the bill and
- 3 renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:
- 4 SECTION ____. Section 164.052(a), Occupations Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A physician or an applicant for a license to practice
- 7 medicine commits a prohibited practice if that person:
- 8 (1) submits to the board a false or misleading
- 9 statement, document, or certificate in an application for a
- 10 license;
- 11 (2) presents to the board a license, certificate, or
- 12 diploma that was illegally or fraudulently obtained;
- 13 (3) commits fraud or deception in taking or passing an
- 14 examination;
- 15 (4) uses alcohol or drugs in an intemperate manner
- 16 that, in the board's opinion, could endanger a patient's life;
- 17 (5) commits unprofessional or dishonorable conduct
- 18 that is likely to deceive or defraud the public, as provided by
- 19 Section 164.053, or injure the public;
- 20 (6) uses an advertising statement that is false,
- 21 misleading, or deceptive;
- 22 (7) advertises professional superiority or the
- 23 performance of professional service in a superior manner if that
- 24 advertising is not readily subject to verification;
- 25 (8) purchases, sells, barters, or uses, or offers to
- 26 purchase, sell, barter, or use, a medical degree, license,
- 27 certificate, or diploma, or a transcript of a license, certificate,
- 28 or diploma in or incident to an application to the board for a
- 29 license to practice medicine;

- 1 (9) alters, with fraudulent intent, a medical license,
- 2 certificate, or diploma, or a transcript of a medical license,
- 3 certificate, or diploma;
- 4 (10) uses a medical license, certificate, or diploma,
- 5 or a transcript of a medical license, certificate, or diploma that
- 6 has been:
- 7 (A) fraudulently purchased or issued;
- 8 (B) counterfeited; or
- 9 (C) materially altered;
- 10 (11) impersonates or acts as proxy for another person
- in an examination required by this subtitle for a medical license;
- 12 (12) engages in conduct that subverts or attempts to
- 13 subvert an examination process required by this subtitle for a
- 14 medical license;
- 15 (13) impersonates a physician or permits another to
- 16 use the person's license or certificate to practice medicine in
- 17 this state;
- 18 (14) directly or indirectly employs a person whose
- 19 license to practice medicine has been suspended, canceled, or
- 20 revoked:
- 21 (15) associates in the practice of medicine with a
- 22 person:
- 23 (A) whose license to practice medicine has been
- 24 suspended, canceled, or revoked; or
- 25 (B) who has been convicted of the unlawful
- 26 practice of medicine in this state or elsewhere;
- 27 (16) performs or procures a criminal abortion, aids or
- 28 abets in the procuring of a criminal abortion, attempts to perform
- 29 or procure a criminal abortion, or attempts to aid or abet the
- 30 performance or procurement of a criminal abortion;
- 31 (17) directly or indirectly aids or abets the practice

- 1 of medicine by a person, partnership, association, or corporation
- 2 that is not licensed to practice medicine by the board;
- 3 (18) performs an abortion on a woman who is pregnant
- 4 with a viable unborn child during the third trimester of the
- 5 pregnancy unless:
- 6 (A) the abortion is necessary to prevent the
- 7 death of the woman;
- 8 (B) the viable unborn child has a severe,
- 9 irreversible brain impairment; or
- 10 (C) the woman is diagnosed with a significant
- 11 likelihood of suffering imminent severe, irreversible brain damage
- 12 or imminent severe, irreversible paralysis;
- 13 (19) performs an abortion on an unemancipated minor
- 14 without the written consent of the child's parent, managing
- 15 conservator, or legal quardian or without a court order, as
- 16 provided by Section 33.003 or 33.004, Family Code, unless the
- 17 abortion is necessary due to a medical emergency, as defined by
- 18 Section 171.002, Health and Safety Code;
- 19 (20) otherwise performs an abortion on an
- 20 unemancipated minor in violation of Chapter 33, Family Code; [or]
- 21 (21) performs or induces or attempts to perform or
- 22 induce an abortion in violation of Subchapter C, F, or G, Chapter
- 23 171, Health and Safety Code; or
- 24 (22) participates in an ethics or medical committee
- 25 meeting reviewing another physician's refusal to honor a patient's
- 26 advance directive or a health care or treatment decision made by or
- 27 on behalf of the patient under Section 166.046, Health and Safety
- 28 Code, and the committee concludes life-sustaining treatment is
- 29 inappropriate unless, based on reasonable medical judgment, the
- 30 life-sustaining treatment requested by or on behalf of the patient
- 31 is:

- 3 benefit to the patient as intended by or on behalf of the patient;

- 5 (B) medically inappropriate because providing
- 6 the treatment to the patient would clearly create a substantially
- 7 greater risk of causing or hastening the death of the patient than
- 8 would withholding or withdrawing the treatment.
