A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to disaster preparation for state agencies and political
- 3 subdivisions.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 418.0155 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 418.0155. SUSPENSION LIST. (a) The governor's
- 8 office, using existing resources, shall compile and maintain a
- 9 comprehensive list of regulatory statutes and rules that may
- 10 require suspension during a disaster.
- 11 (b) On request by the governor's office, a state agency that
- 12 would be impacted by the suspension of a statute or rule on the list
- 13 compiled under Subsection (a) shall review the list for accuracy
- 14 and shall advise the governor's office regarding any statutes or
- 15 rules that should be added to the list.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
- 17 amended by adding Section 418.054 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 418.054. DISASTER PREPARATION CONTRACTS. (a) The
- 19 division, in consultation with other state agencies the division
- 20 considers appropriate, shall develop a plan to assist political
- 21 subdivisions of this state with executing contracts for services
- 22 that political subdivisions are likely to need following a
- 23 disaster. The plan must include:
- 24 (1) training on the benefits to a political

- 1 subdivision from executing disaster preparation contracts in
- 2 advance of a disaster;
- 3 (2) recommendations on the services political
- 4 subdivisions are likely to need following a disaster, including
- 5 debris management and infrastructure repair; and
- 6 (3) assistance to political subdivisions with finding
- 7 persons capable of providing the services described by Subdivision
- 8 (2) and executing contracts with those persons in advance of a
- 9 disaster.
- 10 (b) The division shall consult with the comptroller
- 11 regarding including a contract for services a political subdivision
- 12 is likely to need following a disaster, including debris management
- 13 and infrastructure repair, on the schedule of multiple award
- 14 contracts developed under Subchapter I, Chapter 2155, or as part of
- 15 another cooperative purchasing program administered by the
- 16 <u>comptroller</u>.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
