## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- relating to a student loan repayment assistance program for certain 2
- full-time peace officers in this state. 3
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding 5
- Subchapter NN to read as follows: 6
- SUBCHAPTER NN. PEACE OFFICER LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM 7
- Sec. 61.9951. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "peace 8
- 9 officer" has the meaning assigned by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal
- 10 Procedure.

- Sec. 61.9952. LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED; 11
- 12 PURPOSE. The board shall establish and administer a program to
- provide, in accordance with this subchapter and board rules, loan 13
- 14 repayment assistance in the repayment of eligible loans for
- eligible persons who agree to continued employment as full-time 15
- 16 peace officers in this state for a specified period.
- Sec. 61.9953. INITIAL ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to 17
- receive loan repayment assistance under this subchapter for the 18
- first year for which the person seeks loan repayment assistance, a 19
- 20 person must:
- 21 (1) submit to the board an initial application for the
- loan repayment assistance, in the manner and on a form prescribed by 22
- 23 board rule, that requires:
- 24 (A) employer verification of the person's

- 1 employment as a full-time peace officer in this state for at least
- 2 one year and the person's current employment as a peace officer in
- 3 this state as of the date of the application;
- 4 (B) a transcript of the person's postsecondary
- 5 course work; and
- (C) a statement of the total amount of principal,
- 7 accrued interest, fees, and other charges due on all outstanding
- 8 eligible loans for which the person is applying for repayment
- 9 assistance;
- 10 (2) be a resident of this state as determined by board
- 11 rule;
- 12 (3) have earned at least 60 semester credit hours or
- 13 the equivalent at an institution of higher education or a private or
- 14 independent institution of higher education before the person's
- 15 initial employment as a peace officer;
- 16 (4) be currently employed, and have completed at least
- 17 one year of employment, as a full-time peace officer in this state;
- 18 (5) not be in default on any other educational loan;
- 19 and
- 20 (6) comply with any other requirement adopted by the
- 21 board under this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9954. CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY. (a) Except as
- 23 provided by Subsection (b), after initially qualifying for loan
- 24 repayment assistance under Section 61.9953, a person may continue
- 25 to receive loan repayment assistance in a subsequent year only if
- 26 the person annually submits an application, in the manner and on a
- 27 form prescribed by board rule, that requires employer verification

- 1 of the person's continuous employment as a full-time peace officer
- 2 in this state for the year ending immediately before the date the
- 3 application is submitted under this section.
- 4 (b) A person may not receive loan repayment assistance under
- 5 this subchapter for more than five years.
- 6 Sec. 61.9955. AWARD. (a) Except as provided by this
- 7 section, an eligible person is entitled to receive an annual amount
- 8 of loan repayment assistance payments under this subchapter payable
- 9 to the holders of the eligible person's eligible loans for each year
- 10 of eligibility approved by the board under Section 61.9953 or
- 11 61.9954 in an amount equal to the lesser of \$4,000 or 20 percent of
- 12 the total amount stated in the person's application under Section
- 13 61.9953, subject to the amount of available funding.
- 14 (b) If at the time an eligible person submits an initial
- 15 application under Section 61.9953 the payoff period for the
- 16 person's total outstanding balance of eligible loans is less than
- 17 five years, the board shall make payments under this subchapter to
- 18 the eligible holders of the person's eligible loans in the amounts
- 19 of the payments and accrued interest as those payments become due.
- 20 (c) The total amount of repayment assistance provided under
- 21 this subchapter to an eligible person may not exceed \$20,000.
- 22 (d) If in any year the amount of money available for loan
- 23 repayment assistance under this subchapter is insufficient to
- 24 provide loan repayment assistance to cover all the payments for the
- 25 year for all eligible loans of all eligible persons, the board shall
- 26 establish criteria to determine the amount of available money to
- 27 allocate to the holders of student loans of eligible persons as the

- 1 board determines appropriate to further the purpose of this
- 2 subchapter.
- 3 (e) An eligible person whose annual loan repayment
- 4 assistance under this section is less than the amount necessary to
- 5 cover the amount of principal and interest due on the person's
- 6 eligible loans for that year is responsible for the payment of the
- 7 remainder of the amount due and for otherwise preventing a default
- 8 on the loan.
- 9 Sec. 61.9956. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide
- 10 loan repayment assistance under this subchapter for the repayment
- 11 of any student loan received by an eligible person through any
- 12 lender for the cost of attendance at a public or private nonprofit
- 13 postsecondary educational institution for a semester or other term
- 14 that ended in the five years immediately preceding the person's
- 15 initial employment as a peace officer.
- 16 (b) If the loan is not a state or federal guaranteed student
- 17 loan, the promissory note or other loan agreement document
- 18 governing the terms of the loan must require all the loan proceeds
- 19 to be used for expenses incurred by a person in attending a public
- 20 or private nonprofit postsecondary educational institution.
- 21 <u>(c) The board may not provide loan repayment assistance</u>
- 22 under this subchapter for an eligible loan that is in default on the
- 23 date the person's application for loan repayment assistance is
- 24 submitted under Section 61.9953 or 61.9954.
- Sec. 61.9957. PAYMENT OF LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE. (a)
- 26 The board shall pay any loan repayment assistance under this
- 27 subchapter in a lump sum delivered on the eligible person's behalf

- 1 <u>directly to the holder of the loan.</u>
- 2 (b) Loan repayment assistance provided under this
- 3 subchapter may be applied to any amount due on the loan.
- 4 (c) Each state fiscal biennium, the board shall attempt to
- 5 allocate all money available to the board for the purpose of
- 6 providing loan repayment assistance under this subchapter.
- 7 Sec. 61.9958. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The board may
- 8 solicit and accept gifts, grants, and other donations from any
- 9 public or private source for the purposes of this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9959. RULES; POSTING REQUIRED. (a) The board shall
- 11 adopt rules necessary for the administration of this subchapter.
- 12 (b) The board shall post on the board's Internet website a
- 13 copy of the rules adopted under this subchapter and information
- 14 regarding the program established under this subchapter.
- 15 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board
- 16 shall adopt rules for the peace officer loan repayment assistance
- 17 program under Subchapter NN, Chapter 61, Education Code, as added
- 18 by this Act, not later than December 1, 2019.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
