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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to higher education student loan repayment assistance for peace officers. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter II to read as follows: 6 SUBCHAPTER II. PEACE OFFICER LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM 7 Sec. 61.9851. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "peace 8 9 officer" has the meaning assigned by Article 2.12, Code of Criminal 10 Procedure. Sec. 61.9852. REPAYMENT AUTHORIZED. The board shall 11 12 establish and administer a program to provide, in accordance with this subchapter and board rules, assistance in the repayment of 13 14 student loans for persons who are employed as peace officers by state agencies or political subdivisions of this state and who 15 16 apply and qualify for the assistance. Sec. 61.9853. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive 17 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a person must: 18 19 apply to the board; 20 (2) be a resident of this state; 21 (3) at the time of application for repayment assistance have been employed full-time for at least one year as, 22 23 and be currently employed full-time as, a peace officer by a state 24 agency or political subdivision of this state;

No. 14 (4) have earned at least 60 hours of course credit at a 1 public or private institution of higher education in this state 2 3 before becoming a peace officer; and 4 (5) comply with any additional requirement adopted by 5 board rule. 6 Sec. 61.9854. LIMITATIONS. (a) On qualifying for 7 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a person may receive repayment assistance for each year of employment as a peace 8 officer, not to exceed five years. 9 (b) The amount of repayment assistance that a person may 10 receive for each year of employment as a peace officer may not 11 12 exceed 20 percent of the peace officer's total amount of eligible loans as provided by Section 61.9855. 13 14 (c) The total amount of repayment assistance provided under 15 this subchapter to a person may not exceed \$20,000. 16 (d) The total amount of repayment assistance provided under 17 this subchapter may not exceed the total amount of gifts and grants accepted by the board for the repayment assistance, legislative 18 appropriations for the repayment assistance, and other funds 19 available to the board for the repayment assistance. 20 21 Sec. 61.9855. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide repayment assistance for the repayment of any student loan received 22 by an eligible person through any lender for the cost of attendance 23 24 at a public or private or independent institution of higher education for a semester or other term that ended not earlier than 25 26 60 months before the date of the person initially becoming a peace 27 officer.

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1	(b) The board may withhold repayment assistance for a
2	student loan that is in default at the time of the peace officer's
3	application.
4	(c) The board may not provide repayment assistance for the
5	repayment of a loan for the cost of attendance for credit hours a
6	person earns after becoming a peace officer.
7	(d) If the loan is not a state or federal guaranteed student
8	loan, the note or other writing governing the terms of the loan must
9	require the loan proceeds to be used for expenses incurred by a
10	person to attend a public or private institution of higher
11	education.
12	Sec. 61.9856. REPAYMENT. (a) The board shall pay any loan
13	repayment assistance under this subchapter in a lump sum delivered
14	on the eligible person's behalf directly to the holder of the loan.
15	(b) A repayment under this subchapter may be applied to any
16	amount due in connection with the loan.
17	Sec. 61.9857. ACCEPTANCE OF GIFTS. The board may solicit
18	and accept gifts and grants from any source for the purposes of this
19	subchapter.
20	Sec. 61.9858. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules as
21	necessary to administer this subchapter.
22	(b) The board shall distribute a copy of the rules adopted
23	under this section and pertinent information regarding this
24	subchapter to:
25	(1) each public and private or independent institution
26	of higher education in this state;
27	(2) any appropriate state agency; and

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(3) any appropriate professional association.

2 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 3 shall adopt the rules for repayment assistance under Subchapter II, 4 Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than 5 February 1, 2020.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
