- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 8, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 6 Subchapter E to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER E. MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE RESOURCES FOR
- 8 SCHOOL DISTRICT PERSONNEL
- 9 Sec. 8.151. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter, "local mental
- 10 health authority" and "non-physician mental health professional"
- 11 have the meanings assigned by Section 571.003, Health and Safety
- 12 <u>Code</u>.
- 13 Sec. 8.152. EMPLOYMENT OF NON-PHYSICIAN MENTAL HEALTH
- 14 PROFESSIONAL AS MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE RESOURCE. (a) A
- 15 local mental health authority shall employ a non-physician mental
- 16 health professional to serve as a mental health and substance use
- 17 resource for school districts located in the region served by a
- 18 regional education service center and in which the local mental
- 19 <u>health authority provides services.</u>
- 20 (b) If two or more local mental health authorities provide
- 21 services in a region served by a regional education service center,
- 22 the local mental health authority that primarily operates in the
- 23 county in which the center is located shall employ the
- 24 non-physician mental health professional and, in making any hiring

- 1 decision, consult with other local mental health authorities
- 2 providing services in that region.
- 3 Sec. 8.153. INTERAGENCY COLLABORATION; MEMORANDUM OF
- 4 UNDERSTANDING. (a) A local mental health authority that employs a
- 5 non-physician mental health professional under Section 8.152 and
- 6 the regional education service center shall collaborate in carrying
- 7 out this subchapter.
- 8 (b) Each regional education service center shall provide
- 9 for a non-physician mental health professional employed for the
- 10 region served by the center with a space for the professional to
- 11 carry out the professional's duties under Section 8.155. The local
- 12 mental health authority that employs the professional shall pay the
- 13 center a reasonable administrative cost for providing the space.
- (c) A local mental health authority and a regional education
- 15 <u>service center may enter into a memorandum of understanding for the</u>

- 17 Sec. 8.154. SUPERVISION OF NON-PHYSICIAN MENTAL HEALTH
- 18 PROFESSIONAL. The local mental health authority that employs a
- 19 non-physician mental health professional under Section 8.152

- 21 (1) supervise the professional in carrying out the
- 22 professional's duties under Section 8.155; and
- 23 (2) consult with any other local mental health
- 24 authorities in the region in supervising the professional.
- Sec. 8.155. DUTIES OF NON-PHYSICIAN MENTAL HEALTH
- 26 PROFESSIONAL. (a) A non-physician mental health professional
- 27 employed under Section 8.152 shall act as a resource for school

2	(1) helping personnel gain awareness and a better
3	understanding of mental health and co-occurring mental health and
4	substance use disorders;
5	(2) assisting personnel to implement initiatives
6	related to mental health or substance use under state law or agency

- 2 or provide specific advice to school district personnel regarding a

- 4 Sec. 8.156. PARTICIPATION BY SCHOOL DISTRICT NOT REQUIRED.
- 5 This subchapter does not require a school district to participate
- 6 <u>in training provided by a non-physician mental health professional</u>
- 7 or otherwise use the professional as a resource.
- 8 Sec. 8.157. DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDING. A state agency to
- 9 which money is appropriated to carry out this subchapter shall
- 10 ensure that the money is distributed equally among the local mental
- 11 health authorities that employ and supervise non-physician mental
- 12 health professionals under this subchapter.
- Sec. 8.<u>158. REPORT.</u> (a) Before the last business day of
- 14 each calendar year, each local mental health authority that employs
- 15 and supervises a non-physician mental health professional under
- 16 this subchapter shall prepare and submit a report to the Health and
- 17 Human Services Commission regarding the outcomes for school
- 18 districts and students resulting from services provided by the
- 19 non-physician mental health professional.
- 20 (b) Not later than January 31 of the following calendar
- 21 year, the Health and Human Services Commission shall compile the
- 22 information submitted under this section and prepare and submit a
- 23 report to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 24 representatives, each standing committee of the legislature having
- 25 primary jurisdiction over mental health, and each standing
- 26 committee of the legislature having primary jurisdiction over
- 27 public education.
