## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the regulation of the practice of physical therapy.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 453.301, Occupations Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 453.301. PRACTICE BY PHYSICAL THERAPIST [TREATING
7	PATIENT UNDER PRIOR REFERRAL]. (a) A physical therapist may treat
8	a patient for an injury or condition in a manner described by
9	Section 453.005 without a [that was the subject of a prior] referral
10	if the physical therapist:
11	(1) has been licensed to practice physical therapy for
12	at least one year;
13	(2) <u>is covered by professional liability insurance in</u>
14	the minimum amount required by board rule [notifies the referring
15	practitioner of the therapy not later than the fifth business day
16	after the date therapy is begun]; and
17	(3) <u>either:</u>
18	(A) possesses a doctoral degree in physical
19	therapy from:
20	(i) a program that is accredited by the
21	Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education; or
22	(ii) an institution that is accredited by
23	an agency or association recognized by the United States secretary

of education; or

- 1 (B) has completed at least 30 hours of continuing
- 2 competence activities in the area of differential diagnosis.
- 3 (a-1) Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), a physical
- 4 therapist may treat a patient under Subsection (a) [begins any
- 5 episode of treatment before the first anniversary of the referral
- 6 by the referring practitioner;
- 7 [(4) for physical therapy episodes subsequent to the
- 8 episode which was initiated by the referral, treats the patient]
- 9 for not more than 10 [<del>20 treatment sessions or 30</del>] consecutive
- 10 <u>business</u> [calendar] days[, whichever occurs first; and
- 11 [(5) satisfies any other requirement set by the
- 12 board].
- 13 (a-2) A physical therapist who possesses a doctoral degree
- 14 <u>described by Subsection (a)(3)(A) and has completed a residency or</u>
- 15 <u>fellowship may treat a patient under Subsection (a) for not more</u>
- 16 than 15 consecutive business days.
- 17 (b) The physical therapist must obtain a referral from a
- 18 [confer with the] referring practitioner before the physical
- 19 therapist may continue treatment that exceeds treatment authorized
- 20 under Subsection (a-1) or (a-2), as applicable [(a)(4)].
- 21 <u>(c)</u> A physical therapist who treats a patient without a
- 22 referral shall obtain from the patient a signed disclosure on a form
- 23 prescribed by the board in which the patient acknowledges that:
- 24 (1) physical therapy is not a substitute for a medical
- 25 diagnosis by a physician;
- 26 (2) physical therapy is not based on radiological
- 27 <u>imaging</u>;

- 1 (3) a physical therapist cannot diagnose an illness or
- 2 disease; and
- 3 (4) the patient's health insurance may not include
- 4 coverage for the physical therapist's services.
- 5 SECTION 2. Section 453.351(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) The board may deny a license or suspend or revoke a
- 8 license, place a license holder on probation, reprimand a license
- 9 holder, impose an administrative penalty, or otherwise discipline a
- 10 license holder if the applicant or license holder has:
- 11 (1) except as provided by Section [453.301 or]
- 12 453.302, provided care [physical therapy] to a person outside the
- 13 scope of the physical therapist's practice [without a referral from
- 14 a referring practitioner];
- 15 (2) used drugs or intoxicating liquors to an extent
- 16 that affects the license holder's or applicant's professional
- 17 competence;
- 18 (3) been convicted of a felony, including a finding or
- 19 verdict of guilty, an admission of guilt, or a plea of nolo
- 20 contendere, in this state or in any other state or nation;
- 21 (4) obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraud
- 22 or deception;
- 23 (5) been grossly negligent in the practice of physical
- 24 therapy or in acting as a physical therapist assistant;
- 25 (6) been found to be mentally incompetent by a court;
- 26 (7) practiced physical therapy in a manner detrimental
- 27 to the public health and welfare;

- 1 (8) had a license to practice physical therapy revoked
- 2 or suspended or had other disciplinary action taken against the
- 3 license holder or applicant;
- 4 (9) had the license holder's or applicant's
- 5 application for a license refused, revoked, or suspended by the
- 6 proper licensing authority of another state or nation; or
- 7 (10) in the case of a physical therapist assistant,
- 8 treated a person other than under the direction of a physical
- 9 therapist.
- SECTION 3. Not later than November 1, 2019, the Texas Board
- 11 of Physical Therapy Examiners shall adopt rules necessary to
- 12 implement Section 453.301, Occupations Code, as amended by this
- 13 Act.
- SECTION 4. Section 453.301(c), Occupations Code, as added
- 15 by this Act, applies only to treatment by a physical therapist that
- 16 is provided on or after November 1, 2019. Treatment that is
- 17 provided before November 1, 2019, is governed by the law in effect
- 18 on the date the treatment was provided, and the former law is
- 19 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
