1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of the practice of physical therapy. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 453.301, Occupations Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: 6 Sec. 453.301. PRACTICE BY PHYSICAL THERAPIST [TREATING 7 PATIENT UNDER PRIOR REFERRAL]. (a) A physical therapist may treat a patient for an injury or condition in a manner described by 8 9 Section 453.005 without a [that was the subject of a prior] referral if the physical therapist: 10 11 (1) has been licensed to practice physical therapy for 12 at least one year; 13 (2) is covered by professional liability insurance in 14 the minimum amount required by board rule [notifies the referring practitioner of the therapy not later than the fifth business day 15 16 after the date therapy is begun]; and 17 (3) either: 18 (A) possesses a doctoral degree in physical 19 therapy from: 20 (i) a program that is accredited by the 21 Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education; or 22 (ii) an institution that is accredited by 23 an agency or association recognized by the United States secretary 24 of education; or

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C.S.H.B. No. 29 (B) has completed at least 30 hours of continuing 1 2 competence activities in the area of differential diagnosis. 5 SECTION 2. Section 453.351(a), Occupations Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 (a) The board may deny a license or suspend or revoke a
8 license, place a license holder on probation, reprimand a license
9 holder, impose an administrative penalty, or otherwise discipline a
10 license holder if the applicant or license holder has:

(1) except as provided by Section [453.301 or] (1) except as provided by Section [453.301 or] (1) 453.302, provided <u>care</u> [physical therapy] to a person <u>outside the</u> (1) scope of the physical therapist's practice [without a referral from (1) a referring practitioner];

15 (2) used drugs or intoxicating liquors to an extent 16 that affects the license holder's or applicant's professional 17 competence;

18 (3) been convicted of a felony, including a finding or
19 verdict of guilty, an admission of guilt, or a plea of nolo
20 contendere, in this state or in any other state or nation;

(4) obtained or attempted to obtain a license by fraudor deception;

(5) been grossly negligent in the practice of physical
therapy or in acting as a physical therapist assistant;

(6) been found to be mentally incompetent by a court;
(7) practiced physical therapy in a manner detrimental
to the public health and welfare;

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(8) had a license to practice physical therapy revoked
 or suspended or had other disciplinary action taken against the
 license holder or applicant;

4 (9) had the license holder's or applicant's 5 application for a license refused, revoked, or suspended by the 6 proper licensing authority of another state or nation; or

7 (10) in the case of a physical therapist assistant, 8 treated a person other than under the direction of a physical 9 therapist.

10 SECTION 3. Not later than November 1, 2019, the Texas Board 11 of Physical Therapy Examiners shall adopt rules necessary to 12 implement Section 453.301, Occupations Code, as amended by this 13 Act.

SECTION 4. Section 453.301(c), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, applies only to treatment by a physical therapist that is provided on or after November 1, 2019. Treatment that is provided before November 1, 2019, is governed by the law in effect on the date the treatment was provided, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

20 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
