## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to paid leave for a state employee who is a search and

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 661.905, Government Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 661.905. VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS, [AND] EMERGENCY
- 8 MEDICAL SERVICES VOLUNTEERS, AND SEARCH AND RESCUE VOLUNTEERS. (a)
- 9 In this section:
- 10 (1) "Emergency[, "emergency] medical services
- 11 volunteer" has the meaning assigned by Section 773.003, Health and
- 12 Safety Code.
- 13 (2) "Search and rescue volunteer" means an individual
- 14 who without remuneration, except reimbursement for expenses,
- 15 provides services for or on behalf of an organization that conducts
- 16 search and rescue activities.
- 17 (b) A state employee who is a volunteer firefighter, [ex] an
- 18 emergency medical services volunteer, or a search and rescue
- 19 volunteer is entitled to a leave of absence without a deduction in
- 20 salary to attend fire service, [er] emergency medical services, or
- 21 search and rescue training conducted by a state agency or
- 22 institution of higher education. Leave without a deduction in
- 23 salary under this subsection may not exceed five working days in a
- 24 fiscal year.

- (c) A state agency or institution of higher education may grant leave without a deduction in salary to a volunteer firefighter, [ex] an emergency medical services volunteer, or a search and rescue volunteer for the purpose of allowing the firefighter, [ex] emergency medical services volunteer, or search and rescue volunteer to respond to emergency fire, [ex] medical, or search and rescue situations if the agency or institution has an established policy for granting that leave.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
