2	relating to creating a mentor program for foster youth.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 264, Family Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 264.1214 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 264.1214. FOSTER YOUTH MENTORING PROGRAM. (a) The
7	department shall work with community-based organizations to
8	establish a mentor program to serve foster youth age 14 or older.
9	The mentor program must:
10	(1) match foster youth in a one-on-one mentor
11	relationship with an adult volunteer;
12	(2) focus on building healthy peer networks,
13	increasing self-confidence, and improving optimism about the
14	<pre>future; and</pre>
15	(3) assist foster youth in developing life skills in
16	conjunction with the experiential life-skills training program.
17	(b) The department shall:
18	(1) recruit volunteers, including former foster
19	youth, to serve as mentors; and
20	(2) require volunteer mentors to serve at least eight
21	hours each month for at least one year.
22	(c) A person who volunteers as a mentor is subject to state
23	and national criminal background checks in accordance with Sections

411.087 and 411.114, Government Code.

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- 1 (d) The department shall provide annual evidence-based
- 2 <u>intervention training for all volunteers.</u>
- 3 (e) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this
- 4 section.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2019.
